

Landscape Upgrades at 204 Corfield Street

City crews have been working on landscape upgrades at the intersection of Jensen Avenue and Corfield Street. Unsightly weeds, gravel, and large boulders were removed, and the area landscaped into three overlapping berms. The berms are each planted with a tree, Forest Pansy (*Cercis canadensis*), which will eventually provide shade, height and visual interest at the entrance to the Jensen Greenway.

West Coast Seeds Bee Turf Alternative Lawn Blend was utilized as a ground cover to increase pollinator habitat and also reduce watering and mowing maintenance. For interest, this blend includes Sheep Fescue (*Festuca ovina*), Western Yarrow (*Achillea millefolium*), Microclover (*Trifolium repens* var. *Pipolina*), Baby Blue Eyes (*Nemophila menziesii*), Sweet Alyssum (*Lubularia maritima*), English Daisy (*Bellis perennis*), Roman Chamomile (*Anthemis nobilis*), Perennial Ryegrass (*Lolium perenne*), and White Dutch Clover (*Trifolium repens*).

We have ordered a variety of bulbs for planting this fall, such as Snow Drops, Crocus, Daffodils, Camas, and Alliums which will make their first appearance in 2023, from early spring until mid summer. To complete the upgrade a new downtown bench and garbage can will be added alongside the Corfield sidewalk.
