Parksville-Qualicum Beach Community Update

Campfire Ban Now in Effect

Effective today at noon and until further notice, all open burning, including campfires, beach fires and fireworks, are prohibited within the entire Qualicum Beach Fire Protection Area and the Parksville Fire Protection Area to help prevent human-caused wildfires and protect public safety. This ban has been implemented by the fire chiefs of Qualicum Beach Fire and Parksville Fire Rescue in conjunction with BC Wildfire Service.



This ban applies to open fires of any size, campfires, fireworks, sky lanterns, tiki torches and burning barrels. The ban does not apply to cooking stoves that use gas, propane or briquettes, or to portable campfire apparatus with a CSA or ULC rating using briquettes, liquid or gaseous fuel, that are not capable of producing a flame longer than 15 centimetres. Portable campfire apparatus that do not meet these conditions are prohibited.

Beach fires are not permitted at any time in the Parksville Qualicum Wildlife Management Area which includes the entire waterfront in the Qualicum Beach and Parksville Fire protection areas.

Today, the Regional District of Nanaimo announced the development of a fire protection and open burning regulations <u>interactive map</u> to help residents access fire services related information. The online tool shows residents which fire department provides fire protection services in their area and provides useful links to burning bylaws, venting index information and the province's website for the most up-to-date information on fire bans and restrictions.

Cameron Bluff Wildfire

The Cameron Bluffs wildfire is currently estimated at 140 hectares. BC Wildfire Service reports crews are making reasonable progress considering the burning conditions and that the fire is held within the containment area. There is currently no threat to critical infrastructure or homes and there are no evacuation alerts or orders in place.

Highway 4 is closed, and a detour is open between Youbou and Port Alberni. The Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure advises that while the route is suitable for regular passenger vehicles and commercial vehicles under 14,500 kg, drivers are asked to avoid travel along the route unless it is essential. For drivers who must travel the route, the province urges preparation and caution. Drivers should fill their fuel tank, bring food and water supplies and be prepared for high temperatures along the route.

All partners attend the daily coordination call led by BCWS and there is strong communication and collaboration between all partner agencies.
