Across Canada, today has been designated as the Day of Mourning, a time to honour and remember the 146 workers in British Columbia who lost their lives last year due to workplace injury or disease.

To commemorate, the City's flag is at half-mast and we are encouraged to take a moment to remember those who have lost their lives on the job. Some ways to acknowledge the day:
