## Parksville Fire Rescue 2025 Food Drive Results

Once again, Parksville Fire Rescue's *Fill the Boots for Food* drive was a huge success because of the community's generosity. A total of \$98,714.56 in cash for the Salvation Army food bank was collected over the weekend along with more than sixty new unwrapped toys for the Society of Organized Services.

Craig Bay residents continued their generosity this year, donating 2,941 pounds of food and grocery items to fill food bank shelves and a record \$76,510 in cash donations to help keep the shelves filled in the coming months.

Residents in the Parksville Fire Protection Area generously support the annual drive and are the reason this campaign is so successful.
