# **Parksville-Qualicum Beach Community Update**

### **Winter Preparedness**

With the colder and wetter winter months now here, hazards we may experience change. While we welcome the rain and snow as crucial components in restoring the water in our rivers and lakes after another summer of drought, let's

all be aware of the risks the winter may bring and take some easy steps to prepare. Winter weather hazards in our area can include:

- Snow and ice
- High winds
- Heavy rain
- Extreme cold



These hazards can lead to flooding, prolonged power outages, cold injuries, and transportation challenges.

- Now is a great time of year to check your home emergency kits and pack a grab and go bag in your car.

- Talk with your family and neighbours about your emergency preparedness plans. How will you check in on your family and neighbours if there is a prolonged period without power?
- Get your home ready for winter by completing some easy winterizing steps. Consider insulation, weather stripping and taking steps to prevent pipes from freezing.
- Don't forget to check your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors!

## **Driving in the winter**

Our roads can easily be impacted by winter and make driving challenging or even prevent us being able to travel. Before driving during the winter, people should plan for changing road conditions and ensure their vehicle is properly equipped to drive during the winter. Winter tires are required on many roads in BC from October 1 until April 30.



It is strongly advised you pack an emergency grab and go bag in your vehicle. If a road closes and prevents you from returning home, you may not be eligible to access the provincial Emergency Support Services (ESS) program and instead may be expected to provide your own alterative accommodation or transportation arrangements.

## **Voyent Alert!**

Voyent Alert! Is our community emergency notification system. Unlike the broadcast intrusive alerts issues by the province for Amber Alerts, we cannot send a Voyent Alert! notification to you unless you register with the program.



You can choose how you would like to receive notifications: email, landline or app notification.

### **Atmospheric rivers**

On average, BC experiences 30 to 40 atmospheric rivers per year. Much of the water they bring usually soaks into the ground. In some cases, these weather events can lead to flooding, landslides and avalanches. The <u>River Forecast</u> <u>Centre</u> continuously <u>monitors conditions and provides updates</u> to emergency managers and the public.

#### Learn the different alert levels:

- **High Streamflow Advisory**: River levels are rising or expected to rise rapidly. Fast-flowing bodies of water increase risk to life safety. No major flooding is expected. Minor flooding in low-lying areas is possible.
- Flood Watch: River levels are rising and will approach or may exceed riverbanks. Flooding of areas near affected rivers may occur.
- **Flood Warning**: River levels have exceeded riverbank or will exceed soon. Flooding of areas near affected rivers will result.
