Potential adoptive parents come from an equally diverse range of backgrounds; anyone over the age of 19 who is interested in providing a stable, loving home may be eligible to adopt. It is thanks to these selfless individuals that many children receive the immeasurable benefits of belonging to a family, including the support, assistance, and advice that is necessary to face the challenges of growing up.

“October was Foster Family Awareness Month in Parksville, and it just makes sense to follow that up with Adoption Awareness Month. Adoptive parents make a huge commitment by offering vulnerable children and youth a sense of stability and a permanent loving home.
