

Routine Maintenance Underway in Mark's Nature Park and Nerbus Lane

Mark's Nature Park

City of Parksville staff have begun clean-up efforts in the wooded area of Mark's Nature Park located on Finholm Street North. Similar to work performed in Renz Park in May, clean-up will include lifting of the tree canopies of some trees and substantial clearing of brush.

These efforts will address public safety concerns and should help to create enhanced security for both residents and park users, attracting more residential pedestrian activity. The City's intent is to recapture the intended purpose of the nature park which is about 2.66 acres in size. The first portion of the work will address the park's front entrance on Finholm Street which will improve the street entrance and visibility into the park, increasing public safety. We anticipate the work will be completed next week.

In addition to the City's maintenance in Mark's Nature Park, the owner of the property adjacent to the park has begun clearing the site to address unsightly weeds and invasive species.

Nerbus Lane

City staff are also performing routine maintenance at the end of Nerbus Lane to Mill Street along the sanitary sewer trunk line. Work includes routine clearing and installation of new service connection inspection ports.
