Each species offers a unique contribution to enhancing the biodiversity of the forest.

Over the past few years, the urban forests in the central Vancouver Island region have struggled with drought and invasive species, but with generous donations such as this, the future of our forested and green spaces will be much brighter. Plant material is now in its winter state and come spring and summer there will be plenty of blooms to enjoy.
