Voter Information

Remember your two pieces of ID!

When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification; one containing your name and address, the other containing your name and signature. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification (with at least one with a signature) are still required and you will be required to make a "solemn declaration" as to your residency. Documents which may be accepted:

- BC driver's licence
- BC identification card issued by Motor Vehicles Branch
- Owner's certificate of insurance and vehicle licence issued by ICBC
- BC CareCard
- Birth certificate
- SIN card issued by Human Resources Development Canada
- Canadian passport
- Citizenship card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Real property tax notice issued by City of Parksville
- Credit card or debit card issued by a savings institution
- Bill for electricity, natural gas, water, telephone, or cable

(Other documents MAY be accepted at the discretion of the Presiding Election Official)



Candidate Information

Candidate requirements - to be eligible as a candidate in a local government election, at the time of nomination, you must:

1. Be a Canadian citizen; AND
2. Be 18 years of age or older (**October 15, 2004**) on or before general voting day; AND
3. Have lived in BC for at least 6 months (**March 8, 2022**, is the last day to meet six-month residency requirement for candidates; there is no requirement for a candidate to be a resident or own property in the municipality); AND
4. Have not been disqualified by any law or statute from being nominated, elected or holding office.

Nomination packages may be obtained from the administration department (100 Jensen Avenue East). Papers must be filed with the Chief Election Officer or the Deputy Chief Election Officer during regular office hours beginning at 9 am on **Tuesday, August 30** until 4 pm on **Friday, September 9**.

The evening began with a performance by Salish shxw'aluqwa' (Salish Sisters), traditional singers from Snaw-Naw-As First Nation, a few speeches and the official passing of the management of this new theatre, on behalf of the City, to the Parksville Beach Festival Society. Since July 22, the theatre has hosted weekend concerts including Rock the Park this past weekend.

The Parksville Beach Festival Society will manage the operation of the theatre for the City which includes facility promotion/marketing, rental arrangements, bookings and hosting of events, onsite event management and support, as well as audio/visual equipment storage, operation, and maintenance. Ventureland Playground Improvements

With a grant of \$300,000 from Pacific Economic Development Canada, the City will continue resurfacing in the Lions Ventureland Playground. The City's contribution to these upgrades will be \$100,000. This funding allows for further rubber resurfacing of the play area, making the space more accessible.
