General Voting Day

General voting date is **Saturday, October 15** from 8 am to 8 pm at the Parksville Community Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East or the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church, 550 Pym Street. You may vote at either the Parksville Baptist Church or at the Parksville Community Centre; however, whether you vote at an advance voting opportunity, or at one of the general voting day locations, you will be required to sign a written declaration that you have not voted previously at any other time or location during the election.

Advance Voting

Advance voting takes place on **Wednesday, October 5** and **Wednesday, October 12** from 8 am to 8 pm at the Parksville Community Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East. Special voting opportunities will be held at a number of care facilities for their residents and workers only.

Voting Day Only Registration

The City continues to use "Voting Day Only Registration" and no longer uses a voters' list. All voters will register on the day of voting, at either advance voting or on general voting day. When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification.

When You Vote

When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification; one containing your name and address, the other containing your name and signature. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) are still required and you will be required to make a "solemn declaration" as to your residency.

Two Pieces of Identification

Residents must bring two pieces of identification; documents which may be accepted are:

- BC driver's licence
- BC identification card issued by Motor Vehicles Branch
- Owner's certificate of insurance and vehicle licence issued by ICBC
- BC CareCard
- Birth certificate
- SIN card issued by Human Resources Development Canada
- Canadian passport
- Citizenship card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Real property tax notice issued by City of Parksville
- Credit or debit card issued by a savings institution
- Utility bill for electricity, gas, water, phone, or cable services

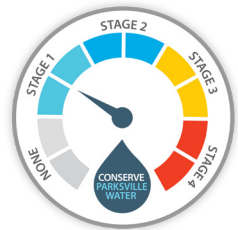
THINGS TO KNOW

Late Payment of Property Taxes

A 2% penalty was applied to current year property taxes outstanding after the due date of July 4, 2022. An additional 8% penalty will be applied to current year property taxes that remain outstanding at the close of business on September 16, 2022. Penalties are applied in accordance with Sections 233 and 234 of the Community Charter and City of Parksville Bylaw No. 1576. The City has no authority to either waive or modify these penalty amounts.

Stage 1 Water Restrictions

Stage 1, in effect for October, allows for watering of lawns between 7 pm and 7 am, any day of the week. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from water restrictions. Stage 2 restrictions remain in place for September.
