THINGS TO KNOW

Utility notices are due October 31. If you do not receive your notice in the mail by October 7, contact the finance department at 250 248-6144 or cashier@parksville.ca.

Stage 1 water restrictions, in effect for October, allow for watering of lawns between 7 pm and 7 am, any day of the week. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from water restrictions. No water restrictions November to March.

You may vote at either the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church or the Parksville Community Centre; however, whether you vote at an advance voting opportunity or at one of the general voting day locations, you will be required to sign a written declaration that you have not voted previously at any other time or location during the election.

Voting Day Information

Am I eligible to vote?

You may vote in the Parksville local government election as a resident elector if you meet these requirements. It does not matter whether you rent or own your home.

- Are a Canadian citizen
- Are, or will be, 18 years of age or more (October 15, 2004) on or before general voting day
- Have lived in BC for at least six months (April 14, 2022) prior to registration
- A resident of Parksville on day of registration
- Are not disqualified from voting by the *Local Government Act* or any other act.

What is "voting day only" registration?

The City continues to use "voting day only registration" and does not use a voters' list. Voters register on the day of voting, at either advance voting or on general voting day.

What documents do I bring with me?

When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification; one containing your name and address, the other containing your name and signature. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) are required and you will be required to make a "solemn declaration" as to residency.

Residents must bring two pieces of identification; documents which may be accepted are:

- BC driver's licence
- BC identification card issued by Motor Vehicles Branch
- Owner's certificate of insurance and vehicle licence issued by ICBC
- BC CareCard
- Birth certificate
- SIN card issued by Human Resources Development Canada
- Canadian passport
- Citizenship card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Real property tax notice issued by City of Parksville
- Credit or debit card issued by a savings institution
- Utility bill for electricity, gas, water, phone, or internet/cable services

Where can I get more information?

The City's website and Let's Talk Parksville provide detailed election information such as frequently asked questions, information for non-resident property electors, candidate contact information and nomination papers. letstalkparksville.ca/election-2022.

The declaration of unofficial results will be announced October 15 and official results by October 19. The inaugural meeting of the newly elected Council will be held on November 7 at 1 pm.
