THINGS TO KNOW

Water Restriction Stage 1 in April allows for watering of lawns between 7 pm and 7 am, any day. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from water restrictions.

Community Celebration for Phil St Luke will be held on Friday, June 9, 7-9 pm at the Parksville Outdoor Theatre in the Parksville Community Park. This is a free event, everyone is welcome. More details in May.

Parksville is the most economically resilient city on Vancouver Island according to BC Business. In the annual ranking of best communities for work, BC Business ranked us number one on Vancouver Island and number three in BC with Squamish in the top spot and North Vancouver second. Fifty BC communities were ranked using indicators such as social, economic resilience, population growth, resident sense of belonging, and environmental aspects. Parksville ranked fifth in 2022, second in 2021 and fifteenth in 2020.

Parksville beaches temporarily closed **to dogs** to limit disturbance of migrating Black Brant geese. This applies to both on-leash and off-leash within the Parksville-Qualicum Beach Wildlife Management Area. Rathtrevor Beach and Parksville Bay beach are closed until April 30.

Accessibility Advisory Committee

The province recently enacted legislation requiring local governments to establish an accessibility committee, develop an accessibility plan to be adopted by September 1, and implement a mechanism for obtaining feedback on accessibility. The committee will provide advice to Council on development of an accessibility plan. The terms of reference may be viewed on our website.

We are looking for individuals to apply for consideration of appointment. The committee will consist of five to seven members, appointed by Council based on their experience and credentials, and to the extent possible, include representation as follows:

- At least half of members to be persons with disabilities, or individuals who support, or are from organizations that support, persons with disabilities.
- Members who reflect the diversity of persons with disabilities
- At least one Indigenous person
- Members who reflect the diversity of persons in BC
- At least one member of Council

Watermain Flushing

Our annual watermain flushing program runs through April. An important part of our ongoing maintenance program, flushing ensures the integrity of the water supply system. Flushing occurs mainly between 7 am and 3:30 pm, weekdays. Residents can expect some discolouration of water and intermittent drops in pressure; keep a fresh supply of drinking water in your fridge. Check for discolouration of water before doing laundry and if discoloured, run outside tap (after 3:30 pm) until clear. ops@parksville.ca.

The work will include renewal of important underground infrastructure and the installation of curbs, streetlights, and street trees where possible. Wood Chipping Program

Annual wood chipping program will take place April 3 through April 28. The City is divided into two zones - west of Craig Street and east of Craig Street. Materials must be curbside by 8 am on:

April 3 Properties WEST of Craig Street April 17 Properties EAST of Craig Street

Piles must be limited to a size of 5 feet wide x 5 feet long x 3 feet high. One pile per strata subdivision or single-family property will be removed by the chipping crew. Branches with a maximum diameter of 6 inches (15cm), stacked with the larger end of the branch or trunk facing



the roadway. Smaller shrub branches piled for ease of access by the chipping crew. [Residents/Wood Chipping]
