Comprehensive Watering Ban

Until further notice, Stage 4 water restrictions, a comprehensive watering ban, is in effect for the City of Parksville. Due to a significant shortfall in precipitation and early above seasonal temperatures, east Vancouver Island is at provincial Drought Level 4. The province has requested water providers reduce usage by implementing stricter watering conditions.

Stage 4 restrictions help ensure the community's essential water needs for drinking water, hygiene and fire protection are met, and water flows for fish and aquatic habitats are maintained. Our region is experiencing early low-flow levels in rivers and streams and the continued warmer and drier-than-seasonal conditions forecast will likely further impact water levels well into the summer. This comprehensive water ban aims to reduce the pressure on surface water and groundwater sources vulnerable to ongoing drought. The ban includes:

- No lawn sprinkling of any kind, including newly seeded and sodded lawns
- No washing of vehicles, RVs and boats
- No washing of driveways, sidewalks, parking lots, and exterior building surfaces
- No filling of swimming pools, hot tubs and garden pond water features
- · Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions
- Drip irrigation and hand watering is permitted using hand-held container or hose with shutoff device between 7 am and 10 am OR 7 pm and 10 pm
