Parksville Fire Prevention Week Open House - October 15

Parksville Volunteer Fire Department members will welcome residents to their annual open house on Sunday, October 15, from 10 am to 2 pm at the Parksville Fire Rescue Training Centre, 1159 Franklins Gull Road.



Learn about fire safety; home fire sprinklers, smoke alarms and home escape plans along with educational displays and activities, how to use a fire extinguisher, perform CPR, try hose and target practice, and there's a kids' bunker gear challenge. The open house features an auto extrication demonstration at 11 am and at 1.30 pm, a side-by-side burn demonstration with two similarly furnished rooms; one protected with fire sprinklers and the other without. The demo shows how quickly a fire can become deadly versus the quick response and effectiveness of a fire sprinkler system in controlling or extinguishing a fire.

This year's fire prevention week theme, "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention," works to educate about simple but important actions one can take to keep themselves

and those around them safe when cooking. Unattended cooking is the leading cause of cooking fires and deaths, and cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries. *Parksvillefirerescue.ca*

Stage 3 Watering Restrictions - Aligned with most Regional District of Nanaimo water service areas, watering restrictions in the City have been downgraded to Stage 3. October is a critical time for aquatic life as stream flows are at seasonal lows prior to the return of significant precipitation and salmon require water levels conducive to migrating to freshwater spawning grounds. Stage 3 lifts the lawn watering ban and allows for outdoor and/or vehicle washing; however, we are asking residents to continue to voluntarily conserve. Info on our website.

BC ShakeOut - October 19

Taking part in an earthquake drill in an easy way to prepare for earthquake safety. Residents are encouraged to ShakeOut on October 19 at 10.19 am. Register at Shakeoutbc.ca to be counted in the drill and to access a range of resources. Intended to create public awareness of earthquake hazards and encourage personal preparedness, participants Drop, Cover and Hold On for two minutes in response to a simulated earthquake event. You can take part at home, at work, or anywhere else you spend time!
