Parksville Community Park Update

The gathering plaza and accessible connections are now substantially complete with most fencing removed and some minor finishing to come. Beyond creating a new space for gathering and social events, a core goal of this project was to increase accessibility and pedestrian movement in the heart of the park. Key element to achieve better accessibility was the removal of curbing and elevation changes and the new raised speed table on Sandcastle Drive adjacent to the plaza supports a consistent and accessible elevation while calming traffic through a busy pedestrian area. New washroom project is substantially complete; the building will remain closed until urinals arrive in January.

Applications are now being accepted from organizations and individuals wishing to hold special events at City-owned venues or on City streets; review process starts January 31. Annual events will be given priority provided the request is received by January 31, after which time applications will be addressed as first-time events on a firstcome, first-served basis, based on availability. 2024 Licence Renewals

Business Licences are due January 31 and may be paid by credit card (Visa or Mastercard) from the City's website; by mail (P O Box 1390, Parksville V9P 2H3); 100 Jensen Avenue East dropbox, or in-person (weekdays, 8 am to 4 pm). Unpaid fees after January 31 will be subject to fines.

> **Dog Licences** - fees are due by January 31. If you own a dog, tags must be purchased in-person from City Hall (Monday to Friday, 8 am to 4 pm) and the BCSPCA (Tuesday to Saturday, noon to 4 pm). Dogs older than six months must be licensed. Until January 31, rate is discounted - spayed/ neutered dogs \$20 and \$30 for un-spayed or un-neutered.

The rate increases to \$25 and \$35 after January 31.
