Great BC ShakeOut

On January 26, 2011, a province wide drill will take place called, the Great British Columbia ShakeOut. Residents, businesses and organizations across BC will take part in the largest earthquake drill in Canadian history! BC is located in a seismically active region where a few thousand earthquakes occur each year in and adjacent to the province. The threat of a major earthquake in the province is real; therefore, we must know how to be prepared.

Intended to create public awareness of earthquake hazards and encourage preparedness, participants "drop, cover and hold on" for two minutes in response to a simulated earthquake event. The City encourages registration at www.shakeoutbc.ca to be counted in the drill and receive further information. The drill is modeled after the Great California ShakeOut, now in its third year. January 26 was chosen to mark the 311th anniversary of the last magnitude 9 earthquake in BC in 1700. Watch the ShakeOut BC website and this page for more information.

Moilliet Street Looking Good

Work on Moilliet Street is now complete with upgrades to road, underground utilities and new street lighting to improve safety. Improvements integrated a sidewalk link between Despard and Highway 19A on the east side and a new section of sidewalk on the west side between Harnish and Hirst. Sidewalks were built with control joints to minimize impact to pedestrians, wheelchairs, scooters and strollers. A linear path was built after an upgrade of the storm drainage system in the right of way to the west of Moilliet Street between Harnish and Hirst in keeping with the Parks and Open Space Master Plan. Missing sidewalk connections were completed on Hirst and Morison as well.



Making Asphalt Beautiful

The parks department has installed two sections of pathway to provide a continuous pedestrian link from Highway 19A to the waterfront walkway. The new sections received an innovative design by Square One Paving in Victoria. The stamped asphalt produces a design directly on the existing asphalt base. The crosswalk from north of the tennis courts to the play area and spray park is also being given this treatment which will bring higher visibility to the busy crosswalk. The treatment, successfully used in other municipalities, produces long-wearing, reflective, slip resistant and aesthetically appealing surfaces.
