## City News

### Parksville Mayor Resigns

On January 4, in accordance with the Community Charter, Part 5, Section 121, Ed Mayne, Mayor of the City of Parksville submitted his letter of resignation to the City's corporate officer. The resignation was effective immediately and per subsection (3), once a resignation has been delivered, it may not be revoked. Under the Community Charter, Local Government Act and City of Parksville Council Procedures Bylaw, Council will consider the options available to them at a special meeting on January 10. Options include a possible by-election, continuing with the currently appointed deputy mayor or choosing a different Council member to preside until the 2011 municipal election. The City's current Deputy Mayor is Councillor Al Greir.

### Great BC ShakeOut - January 26



On January 26 at 10 am, thousands of British Columbians will *Drop, Cover and Hold On* in the Great British Columbia Shakeout, the largest earthquake drill in Canadian history. Intended to create public awareness of earthquake hazards and encourage personal preparedness, participants will *Drop, Cover and Hold On* for two minutes in response to a simulated earthquake event.

At this time, more than 210,000 participants are registered in BC with 84,000 registered on Vancouver Island. The BC Shakeout website at [shakeoutbc.ca](http://shakeoutbc.ca) has a wealth of information about how you can participate and most importantly, how to perform the *Drop, Cover and Hold On* a quake-safe action designed to protect people from objects that can become projectiles during ground shaking.



As well, there is a life safety drill designed to engage people to think through their own emergency response actions during the drill, then afterwards to review and discuss what worked or what did not, in order to make improvements for the next drill or an actual earthquake. The website also provides information on participating in the exercise at your workplace.

BC is located in a seismically active region where a few thousand earthquakes occur each year in and adjacent to the province. The threat of a major earthquake in the province is real; therefore, we must ensure we all know how to be prepared.

The City encourages residents and businesses to register at [www.shakeoutbc.ca](http://www.shakeoutbc.ca) to be counted in the drill and to receive further information. The drill is modeled after the successful Great California ShakeOut, now in its third year. The January 26 date marks the 311th anniversary of the last magnitude 9 earthquake in BC.

### City Appoints Manager of Engineering

The function of the seven member APC is to advise Council on matters respecting land use and community planning that are referred to the Commission by Council. Applicants with experience in land use planning, architectural design or related fields would be an asset, although this is not a prerequisite.

Anyone interested in serving on the Commission should send their application to Gayle Jackson, Director of Community Planning, City of Parksville. Applications will be accepted until January 31 at which time Council will make the appointment and advise the applicant.
