The City's public works staff provide a variety of services that enhance the daily lives of Parksville residents. Services include design, construction, operations and maintenance of our roads and sidewalks, street lighting and traffic signals, parks, nature trails, as well as our water distribution system, sewage collection system, drainage facilities and City buildings and fleet. Public works are responsible for vital City systems and services on a 24/7 basis; services vital to our community's health, safety and comfort.

Activities will interest residents of all ages with demonstrations, displays, refreshments and a chance to explore and ask questions of our public works professionals. The public is welcome and encouraged to attend, activities are free.

Arrowsmith Water Service

On April 26, the AWS management board met to receive presentations and reports regarding the AWS capital plan study, communications strategy and staff reports. The public was provided with the opportunity to comment and ask questions about the Final Summary Report prepared by Associated Engineering Ltd. This report, along with AWS board minutes for 2009, 2010 and 2011 and the April 26 PowerPoint presentation, is on the AWS website www.arrowsmithwaterservice.org. New Recruits Now On Board

The PVFD recently completed a successful recruitment campaign. The 11 new recruits were on board May 2 for their first training session. The recruits have started an intensive training program which will give them the basic education and skills required to begin to work as members of the department. This is a team that has the ability to respond and deal effectively with emergencies when the public calls upon the services of the Parksville Volunteer Fire Department. Volunteer members are the department's most important resource and with these promising recruits, the department now has its full complement of members.

2011 City Taxes

At the May 9 meeting, Council set the residential property tax increase at 3% for 2011-2015 and for commercial and light industrial properties, taxes will increase by 4% for 2011-2013 and 3% for 2014-2015. Council also approved the 2011-2015 financial plan now available on the website. This plan sets out the financial requirements to enable departments to carry out projects for remainder of 2011.

In April, members of the Canadian Union of Postal Workers voted 94.5% in favour of a strike and although negotiations continue, Canada Post workers could strike later this month. The City will attempt to mail tax notices by May 18 in advance of a possible postal strike on May 24. Should tax notices not be mailed prior to the strike, information will be posted on the City's website regarding alternative ways to obtain your tax notice and claim the homeowner grant. Tax payments must be received by the City and the homeowner grant claimed by July 4 to avoid penalty. This applies regardless of whether you have received your tax notice or not.

Oceanside Homeless Count

The Oceanside Task Force on Homelessness, with the assistance of volunteers, will conduct a homeless count on May 30. When we know where, how many homeless are in the Oceanside region and the reasons for homelessness, we will be better able to plan and identify resources and services for the homeless.
