2012 Budget Process Completed

The City held four public meetings to compile input on budgets and tax rates. Staff presented the 2012 budget, detailing levels of services, service priorities, spending packages, how City services are funded and how municipal tax dollars are spent. Service priorities were considered in seven categories – health and safety, legislative, development and maintenance of municipal infrastructure and assets, protection of private property, organizational welfare, economic welfare and social welfare.

On April 3, Parksville Council wrapped up budget deliberations by approving a 3% tax increase for 2012. In order to provide funds for capital infrastructure renewal, the budget includes a freeze on operating expenditures over the next five years in the areas of protection of private property, organizational welfare, economic welfare and social welfare. PLAN PARKSVILLE

In March, a special joint meeting of the OCP advisory committees was held to identify shared values and goals of the community. Committee members, members of Council, staff and the public participated.

The facilitator helped the group form a clear future vision for Parksville and for the OCP. The “common vision” came together through conversation and a collage which was made up of images, stories and best hopes for Parksville as told on postcards by participants. As well, a graffiti board highlighted what people saw as the best future of Parksville.

The City’s Official Community Plan advisory committees, staff and consultants have been busy with many activities and are now ready for next steps in the process.

Plans are underway for a workshop with opening session and a community open house; all events will be held at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre.
