We're Ready for Snow!

City staff monitor road and weather conditions 24/7 during the winter months. When snow and icy conditions are forecast, crews and equipment are prepped and when it snows, crews are dispatched to keep our roads safe.

Our first priority during and after a snowfall is to clear major arterial streets (such as Island Highway, Alberni Highway) as well as access to emergency services. Clearing collector streets (such as Temple, Pym, Hirst) is the second priority. Once conditions have stabilized on these routes, crews begin to clear residential streets. Should we experience continued snow, it may take crews longer to reach residential streets. If there is an emergency and your street it is not yet plowed, emergency services will notify the City and we will send a plow immediately.

What you can do to help – clearing of sidewalks is the responsibility of property owners. To learn more about snow removal, what you can do to help and how best to prepare, see the City's website [home page link].

Highway 19A Snow Closures

Should there be a significant snowfall, one lane of Highway 19A between Corfield Street and McCarter Street will be closed to allow kids to more safely use the slope from Highway 19A into the Community Park sports field for tobogganing. The City will use traffic control measures to facilitate the temporary lane closure.

Sunray Beach Access Now Open

Public access to Sunray Beach is once again open to the public with the completion of a staircase at the north end of Sunray Road. Constructed from structural marine grade aluminum with reinforced concrete decking and stair treads, the staircase has four landings and 97 steps. Cost of the project was \$158,340.

Notice to Dog Owners in Parksville

In Parksville, all dogs over the age of six months must be licenced and wearing a tag. For residents whose dogs were licenced in 2013, reminder notices have been mailed. Due by January 31, licences are valid for the calendar year and may be purchased from Parksville City Hall.



By January 31, spayed/neutered \$20, not spayed/neutered \$30 and after January 31, spayed/neutered \$25, not spayed/neutered \$35.

The main benefit for dog owners is the quick return of dogs should they become lost and then found by someone else. For taxpayers, there is a cost to maintain our off leash dog park, provide doggie bags and also bylaw enforcement. Dog licence fees provide a means to offset some of these costs and also help the City handle public safety concerns of stray, off leash and aggressive/dangerous dogs.

And, it's the law! Bylaw 1284 states, "no person shall keep, harbour or have in his possession any dog over the age of six months unless a valid and subsisting licence has been issued in respect of that dog."



Holiday Hours

City Hall and public works will be closed December 25, December 26 and January 1. Public works will be closed on December 27 and there will be limited service at PCTC. For afterhours public works emergency, call 250 248-6144 (4 pm to 8 am, Monday to Friday, weekends and holidays).



Notice to Businesses

Existing business licence holders may now renew for the 2014 calendar year. Fees are due by January 31 and may be mailed or paid at City Hall. Bylaw 1483 requires that all businesses obtain a valid licence if carrying on business in the City.

In 2014, the City will offer for the first time, an inter-community business licence. More information may be found on the website [Business/Licences].

APC members are appointed pursuant to the Local Government Act and serve without remuneration.

Applications received after January 31 will be considered on a first come, first served basis depending on availability. Applications received after January 31 must be submitted at least thirty days prior to the event.
