LECTION **Parksville Votes 2014**

Why should I vote?

The City of Parksville provides important services used by residents every day. When you vote, you will help decide who will make important decisions about your community and schools for the next four years. As a resident you have the opportunity to vote for Mayor, six Councillors and two School Trustees.

Am I eligible to vote?

You may vote in the Parksville municipal election as a resident elector if you meet these requirements. It does not matter whether you rent or own your home:


- Are a Canadian citizen; AND
- Will be 18 years of age or older on November 15; AND
- Have lived in BC for at least 6 months (since May 13) prior to registration and have lived in or have owned property in Parksville for at least 30 days (by October 15) prior to registration; AND
- Are not disqualified from voting by the Local Government Act or any other act.

When and where do I vote?

General Voting Day is Saturday, November 15 from 8 am to 8 pm at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East or the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church, 550 Pym Street. You may vote at either the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church or at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre, however, whether you vote at an advance voting opportunity or at one of the general voting day locations, you will be required to sign a written declaration that you have not voted previously at any other time or location during the election. Advance voting is available on November 12 from 8 am to 8 pm at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East.

What is "voting day only" registration?

How residents vote in the November civic election has changed. The City will use "Voting Day Only Registration" and no longer use a voters' list. All voters will register on the day of voting, at either advance voting or on general voting day. When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification with your name and address [at least one with a signature]. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification [at least one with a signature] are still required and you must then make a solemn declaration as to your residency.



What documents must I bring with me?

When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification containing your name and address (at least one with a signature). If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification (at least one with a signature) are still required and you must then make a solemn declaration as to your residency.

Documents which may be accepted are:

- BC driver's licence
- BC identification card issued by Motor Vehicles Branch
- Owner's certificate of insurance and vehicle licence issued by ICBC
- BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard
- Birth certificate
- SIN card issued by Human Resources Development Canada
- Canadian passport
- · Citizenship card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Real property tax notice issued by City of Parksville
- · Credit or debit card issued by a savings institution
- Utility bill for electricity, gas, water, phone or cable services

After January 31, applications will be addressed as first-time events - first come, first served, depending on venue availability. After January 31, applications must be received at least thirty days prior to the event.
