# We're Ready for Snow... Are You?

City staff monitor road and weather conditions 24/7 during winter months. When snow and icy conditions are forecast, crews and equipment are prepped and when it snows, crews are dispatched to keep roads safe.

The City's first priority during and after a snowfall is to clear major arterial streets (such as Island Highway, Alberni Highway) as well as access to emergency services (RCMP, fire hall, ambulance station). Clearing collector streets (such as Temple, Pym, Hirst) is the second priority. Once conditions have stabilized on priority routes, crews will begin to clear residential streets. Should snowfall continue, crews may take longer to reach residential streets. If there is an emergency on your street, call 911 and emergency services will advise the City to send a plow immediately.

Clearing of sidewalks is the responsibility of property owners. The owner / occupier is responsible under Traffic Bylaw 1436 to remove all snow or ice from all sidewalks bordering their property within 12 hours of the end of the snowfall. During periods of heavy snowfall and during regular hours of operation, City crews will support public clearing of sidewalks on streets with high pedestrian traffic. such as arterials and roads in the downtown core.

#### **Notice to Businesses**

Existing business licence holders may now renew for the 2015 calendar year. Fees are due by January 30 and may be mailed or paid at City Hall. Bylaw 1483 requires that all businesses obtain a valid licence if carrying on business in the City. More information may be found on the website [Business/Licences].

Island Highway East snow closures - should there be significant snowfall, one lane of Island Highway East (Highway 19A) between Corfield and McCarter Streets will be closed to allow safe use of the slope from Island Highway into the Community Park sports field for tobogganing. Traffic control measures will facilitate the temporary lane closure.

#### **Notice to Dog Owners in Parksville**

Dog licence fees are due by January 30, 2015. Current dog licences will receive a reminder notice; if you do not receive a notice and/or currently own a dog, licences may be purchased from City Hall.

- By January 30, Spayed/neutered \$20; not spayed/neutered \$30
- After January 30, Spayed/neutered \$25; not spayed/neutered \$35

The main benefit of licencing is the quick return of dogs should they become lost. As well, the fees collected partially offset the cost to maintain our off-leash dog park, provide doggie bags and dispensers throughout the City and provide bylaw enforcement to handle public safety concerns of stray, off-leash and dangerous dogs.

And, it's the law! Bylaw 1284 states, "no person shall keep, harbour or have in his possession any dog over the age of six months unless a valid and subsisting licence has been issued in respect of that dog." The bylaw also states no more than two dogs may be kept on parcels of land less than two acres.
