A Vote About Water

The City of Parksville and the Regional District of Nanaimo (Nanoose Bay Peninsula) are moving forward with an expansion to the drinking water supply which will ensure a safe and secure water system for the community. The Englishman River Water Service project includes:

- In-river water supply intake designed/located to consider the needs of river users and to protect aquatic habitat.
- Water treatment plant with a minimum of 16 million litres per day of membrane filtration capacity to comply with new water regulatory treatment standards.
- Transmission supply mains to homes and businesses.

Construction of the river intake is the next phase of

improvement for our community's water supply following construction of the Arrowsmith Dam in 1999. Design of the intake is underway with construction scheduled for June 2016 followed by design and installation of the water treatment facility,



scheduled for operation in summer 2018.

Earlier this year, the \$28.3 million project shared between the City and the RDN, received \$6 million in funding from the federal and provincial governments. Costs will be spread out over 25 years with less reliance on current user fees. To provide for anticipated annual operating and capital costs as well as future \$5.6 million debt retirement costs, annual water rate increases for water services for the City of Parksville will increase between 2.25% to 2.5% for the years 2016 through 2024 – about \$10 per year for an average household.

Assent Voting Opportunity

The assent voting question will read as follows:

On November 21, the citizens of Parksville will participate in an assent voting opportunity, previously referred to as a referendum. The City is asking residents to approve a bylaw to authorize the borrowing of up to \$5.6 million to construct a new water intake, water treatment plant and transmission lines.

Do you agree to the adoption of City of Parksville Loan Authorization Bylaw, 2015, No. 1519 which will authorize the City of Parksville to borrow \$5.6 million to construct a water intake and treatment facility in accordance with Island Health requirements.



Voting Day: Voting date is Saturday, **November 21** from 8 am to 8 pm at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre, 132 Jensen Avenue East or the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church, 550 Pym Street.

You may vote at either the Parksville Fellowship Baptist Church or at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre, however, whether you vote at an advance voting opportunity, or at one of the general voting day locations, you will be required to sign a written declaration that you have not voted previously at any other time or location during the election.

Advance Voting: Advance voting takes place on Thursday, **November 12** and Wednesday, **November 18** from 8 am to 8 pm at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre, 132 lensen Avenue East.

When You Vote: The City will again use voting day only registration. All voters will register on the day of voting, at either advance voting or on general voting day. You will be required to provide two pieces of identification [one with your name and address and the other with your name and signature]. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification [at least one with a signature] are still required and you must then make a solemn declaration as to your residency.

Two Pieces of Identification: Residents must bring two pieces of identification; documents which may be accepted are:

- BC driver's licence
- BC identification card issued by Motor Vehicle Branch
- Owner's certificate of insurance and vehicle licence issued by ICBC
- BC CareCard or BC Gold CareCard
- Birth certificate
- SIN card issued by Human Resources Development Canada
- Canadian passport
- Citizenship card issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Real property tax notice issued by City of Parksville
- Credit or debit card issued by a savings institution
- Utility bill for electricity, gas, water, phone or cable services
- Other documents MAY be accepted at the discretion of the presiding election official.
