City Services

Budget and Property Taxes

At the May 2 meeting, Council gave three readings to the 2016 budget included in the Five Year Final Financial Plan bylaw for 2016-2020 and three readings to the tax rate bylaw for 2016. Bylaws are up for adoption at a special Council meeting on May 10.

Based on the 2016-2020 Financial Plan, Council set a 4.5% tax increase for all properties in 2016. This will increase the municipal portion of the property taxes by about \$57.50 from 2015 for the average priced single family dwelling. The 2016-2020 final financial plan, now on the City's website [Quicklinks/Reports], sets the financial authority to enable departments to carry out projects.

Tax notices will be mailed later this month and to avoid penalty, payment must be received by the City and the homeowner grant claimed by Monday, July 4, 2016.

Water Restriction Stage 2

Stage 2 is now in effect in the City for the months of May through September unless otherwise advised. With Stage 2, sprinkling can only occur on even days for even-numbered houses and on odd days for odd-numbered houses. Sprinkling is permitted for a maximum of two hours between 7-10 am or 7-10 pm for a maximum of two hours per day of watering. The City thanks residents for their efforts to conserve water this summer. [Quicklinks/Water Conservation]


Water Saver Contest

a census taken every five years provides a statistical portrait of the country and its people. It is mandatory for all residents in Canada to participate in the census; this includes Canadian citizens, landed immigrants, refugee claimants and people who hold a work or study permit.
