City Services

Property Taxes Due Monday, July 4

Tax notices for the current year were mailed in May. Contact the City's property tax department (250 248-6144) if you have not received your notice. Prior to July 4, residents must claim the homeowner grant by bringing the completed application to City Hall or by claiming the grant online [Online Services]. Homeowner grant applications must be completed each year that you are eligible. If the July 4 deadline is not met, your property tax account will have an outstanding balance and receive an immediate 5% penalty.

Water Restrictions Stage 2

Stage 2 is in effect in the City through September unless otherwise advised by the City. With Stage 2, sprinkling can only occur on even days for even-numbered houses and on odd days for odd-numbered houses. Sprinkling is permitted for a maximum of two hours between 7-10 am or 7-10 pm for a maximum of two hours per day of watering. The City thanks residents for their efforts to conserve water this summer. [Quicklinks/Water Conservation]

Permissive Tax Exemptions

Under the provisions of the Community Charter, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Deadline for application is noon, June 30. Details, application form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the website [Public Notices].
