The PVFD relies on volunteer firefighters and is now recruiting. You need to live in the Parksville fire protection area (ideally Parksville), be reasonably fit, available for weekly fire practices, have a good driving record and between the

ages of 19 and 60 for regular members. Volunteer, paid oncall firefighters respond to emergencies 365 days a year. You will be trained, challenged and your life will change. The department also offers a junior program for those under the age of 19, providing a great introduction to life as a PVFD member.

Budget Deliberation Meetings

Council extends an invitation to residents to attend open budget deliberation meetings regarding the draft final 2017 -2021 budget and 2017 financial plan. Meetings will be held in the Forum, 100 Jensen Avenue East at 6 pm on Wednesday, March 15 and Wednesday, March 29.

Comments should be received by March 9 to be considered by Council on March 15 and by March 23 for the March 29 meeting and will form part of the public record. Budget meetings may also be viewed live and archived through webstreaming from the City's website.



Water Main Flushing

The City's annual watermain flushing program runs through the first week in April. Flushing is an important part of our ongoing maintenance program to ensure the integrity of the water supply system. Flushing will take place mainly between 7 am and 3:30 pm, Monday to Friday. During these times, residents can expect some discolouration of water and intermittent drops in water pressure and should keep a fresh supply of drinking water in your refrigerator. Check for discolouration of water before doing laundry and should water be discoloured, run an outside tap (after 3:30 pm) until the water runs clear. Please direct questions to 250 248-5412.

Community Park Mobile Food Concession RFP

"No Dogs" Beach Closures

Our beaches are popular spots for migrating Brant geese, vulnerable to disturbances and for this reason, Parksville beaches within the Parksville-Qualicum Beach Wildlife Management Area will be closed to dogs:

- Parksville Beach is closed to dogs, both on-leash and off-leash from March 1 to April 30.
- Rathtrevor Beach will be closed to dogs, both on-leash and off-leash until April 30.
