

Draft Community Park Master Plan Open House - October 28

The student team from Vancouver Island University is looking forward to presenting the draft Community Park Master Plan to residents for consideration and comments. The drop-in open house on Saturday, October 28 will be held at the Parksville Community and Conference Centre from 10 am to 2 pm.

The draft plan presented to Council earlier this month included draft recommendations as well as methodology, guiding principles, priority recommendations and short to long-term concept visions. This information will be provided to residents on October 28 and may be viewed on the City's website. Comments received on October 28 will then go to Council for their consideration when approving the final Community Park Master Plan.

The Community Park often described as the jewel of Parksville, supports many activities for all ages, from special events to the more simple pleasures of walking along the waterfront and the enjoyment of nature. Since the project first started early this year, VIU students have held a variety of public engagement and consultation activities to inform the twenty-year vision and master plan for the Community Park. Engagement included events such as Parks on the Streets, a World Café, Gazebo

Talks, one-onone picnic table meetings and online and inperson surveys.

2018 Special Events Applications

Applications from organizations and individuals wishing to hold special events at City-owned venues or on City streets in 2018 are now being accepted with the review process starting January 30. Annual events will be given priority provided the request is received by January 29, after which time applications will be addressed as first-time events on a first-come, first-served basis, based on availability. After January 30, applications must be received at least thirty days prior to the event. The special events policy and application forms are available on the website [City Hall/ Special Events Procedures], from the operations department and at City Hall. Special event applications received after January 30 must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the event date and will be subject to the same terms and conditions as those applications received prior to January 30, 2018.
