Provided by the City of Parksville and the Town of Qualicum Beach, Voyent Alert! is a multi-purpose communication service which will be used to send alerts to residents, businesses and

visitors during critical events such as floods or fire as well as relevant day-to-day communications such as road closures, snow removal and water advisories.

Anyone who registers for the Parksville-Qualicum Beach notification system will receive personalized information such as the distance and direction from an incident and preferred evacuation routes from locations the subscriber chooses. The service allows registrants to create and set multiple locations such as workplace, a child's school or a relative's home. Notifications about life-safety events related to those locations will then be sent to registrants through the Voyent Alert! system on whichever communications method has been selected.

Alerts can be sent over mobile apps, text/SMS, email or voice dial. You can register for one or more of these channels and smart alerting capabilities ensure notification when a communication is relevant to you or one of the locations you are tracking. Registration is FREE, simple and anonymous.

Reminder to residents to register for the 2019 Great BC Shakeout drill. It's a great way for families or businesses to become better prepared to survive and recover guickly from major earthquakes.

Drop, Cover, Hold On – drop to the ground, take cover under a table or desk and hold on as if a real earthquake was occurring. It's a chance to learn what you should do if you have a disability or physical limitation. And while taking cover, look around and imagine what would happen in a major earthquake. What would fall? Leaves on Streets

Fall street sweeping by the City is intended to remove leaves which fall



onto the streets and may result in blocked catch basins and safety hazards for cyclists. Leaf control is the responsibility of property owners. Leaves must not be raked or blown from lawns onto the street in anticipation of the City's sweeper truck. Doing so overwhelms the capacity of the sweeper and when blown across sidewalks, may compromise pedestrian safety. Blowing or raking leaves into the gutter is illegal and subject to a fine of \$75 (Traffic Bylaw 1436).
