City Budget Process

Budget discussions will continue in December to determine the City's financial plan for 2020 through 2024. Residents are encouraged to attend budget meetings at 2 pm in the Parksville Civic and Technology



Centre on December 3 and if required, December 10. Public input is an important part of the financial planning process and Council wishes to receive comments and suggestions from residents. Here are a few options to contribute and learn about the budget process:

- If not familiar with the City's budget information, municipal budgets and financial plans are available from the website.

2020 Business Licences

Existing business licence holders may now renew for the 2020 calendar year. Renewal invoices will be mailed the first week in December. Fees are due by January 31, 2020, and may be mailed or paid at City Hall. Bylaw 1483 requires all businesses obtain a valid licence if carrying on business in the City. More info including details about the Inter-Community Business Licence may be found on the website [Business/Licences].

2020 Dog Licences

Dog licence fees are due by January 31. Current dog licences will receive a reminder notice; if you do not receive a notice and currently own a dog, licences may be purchased from City Hall and the BC SPCA. The main benefit of licensing is the quick return of dogs should they become lost. As well, fees collected help to offset the cost to maintain our off-leash dog park, provide bags and dispensers throughout the City and provide bylaw enforcement to handle public safety concerns of stray, off-leash and dangerous dogs.

2020 Special Events

The City's special events policy is under review. If you wish to submit an event application for 2020, please email a letter of intent, including contact information, desired venue and date/time of event to <code>ops@parksville.ca</code>. Once the review is complete, an event application form will be emailed.

Where conflicting dates occur, annual events will be given priority provided the request is received no later than January 31, 2020. First-time events will be handled on a first-come, first-served basis depending on venue availability. After January 31, applications must be submitted at least thirty days prior to the event date, subject to the same terms and conditions as those applications received prior to January 31, 2020.
