Protecting Our Water Supply

Protection and enhancement of the water supply, a priority for the City of Parksville and the Englishman River Water Service, is reflected in the mission statement, "An environmentally sensitive use of water to improve fish habitat and domestic water supply." To successfully accomplish this mission requires careful stewardship of both the surface water and groundwater sources.

COVID-19 does not present a threat to the safety of the treated water. The ERWS water treatment plant uses membrane filtration, ultra-violet light (UV) and chlorine disinfection. Benefits include reduced health risks and improved water quality. Membrane filtration removes bacteria and viruses naturally found in surface river water and the ability to deal with spikes in turbidity (muddy water). The plant employs a multi-step treatment process which includes filtration and disinfection to remove and kill viruses, including coronaviruses as well as bacteria and other pathogens.

The new water treatment plant, commissioned in January 2020, is well equipped to protect the integrity of the drinking water supply. Island Health issued operating permits to ERWS and we are in compliance with operating guidelines. ERWS has many safeguards in place to protect the integrity of our water system:

- Emergency response plan for water treatment and water distribution systems.
- During testing, City and Regional District of Nanaimo staff received extensive training and a Level 4 water treatment operator was hired to run the daily operations of the plant. In addition to the Level 4 operator, the plant employs one Level 3 water treatment operator as well as three Level 2 water treatment operators, all capable of providing coverage in an emergency.
- The City's mutual aid agreements include operational support for the water treatment plant from neighbouring governments in the event of an emergency. This could include sharing of skilled/certified staffing for plant operations.
- Arrangements have been made with other mid-Island local governments to allow sharing of qualified staff should there be staff shortages during the COVID-19 pandemic. CUPE 401 has agreed there would be no collective agreement barriers to facilitating this need.

For the assurance of our residents, the virus that causes COVID-19 has not been detected in drinking water. Conventional water treatment methods using filtration and disinfection, such as those in most municipal drinking water systems, should remove or inactivate the virus that causes COVID-19.

It is heartwarming to see Parksville residents coming together to help stop the spread of COVID-19 in our community. Staying home and staying safe is working. Thank you for doing your part to help flatten the curve.

BC Property Tax Deferment

The Property Tax Deferment program is a low interest loan program which helps qualified BC homeowners pay annual property taxes on their principal residence. You may qualify if 55 or older during the current year, person with disabilities, or family supporting children in certain circumstances. In May, a new online portal will make deferring property taxes easier, allowing residents to apply or renew online directly with the province. Questions should be directed to 1 888 355-2700 or search BC Property Tax Deferral.

Please note that the City can no longer accept deferment applications or renewals. Unpaid taxes, utilities, penalties and interest from prior years must be paid to the City to be eligible to defer current year taxes and you must apply for the homeowner grant if you're eligible, once property tax notices are mailed in May.

Utility Notices

Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the due date for City utility notices covering water, sewer, garbage and recycling has been extended to June 30. If you did not receive your notice in the mail, please call 250 248-6144. With City offices closed to the public until further notice, we encourage the public to pay this utility bill via Canada Post or through online or telephone banking.

Water Restrictions

Stage 2 in effect through September (unless otherwise notified) allows for every other day lawn watering between 7 and 10 am or 7 and 10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from restrictions. [Quicklink/Water Conservation]
