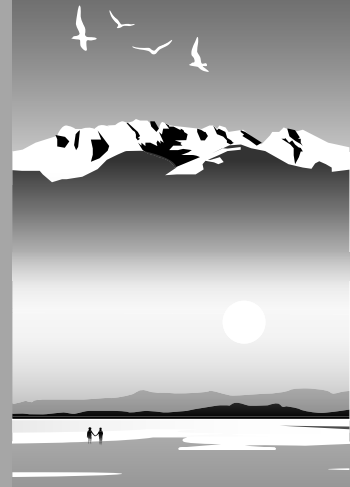

Veteran Remembrance Banners

Through November, colourful commemorative banners to honour local veterans who gave their lives in World War I and World War II, will be displayed along Highway 19A between McMillan Street and McVickers Street. There are sixty names on the Parksville Cenotaph from the two world wars and through extensive research we have been able to obtain images and information for thirty-one veterans.

Although our research has presented some incredible findings, it has also posed many challenges. Our experienced researcher, Valda Stefani, has been pleased to pursue the veterans' stories even though archives worldwide were closed for months due to the pandemic. She established relationships with military museums and other researchers and conducted interviews to ensure we were able to put faces to as many names as possible. Many of the local young men who enlisted, especially in World War I, had recently arrived from places as far away as the United Kingdom and Australia and were too young to have started families, adding to the challenge of finding photographs.

Over the next year, we will continue the research and as the program evolves, will share photographs and stories on our website. We are still looking for information on many of the veterans and have posted a list on our website [City Hall/Veteran Remembrance Banners]. BC ShakeOut - October 15 at 10.15 am

As we adapt to living and working during the COVID-19 pandemic and while we are doing a great job in adjusting to these new challenges, earthquakes, storms, forest fires and other natural disasters continue to occur. One of the ways to be prepared is to practice how to be safe during an earthquake. Although the 2020 Shakeout drill may look a little different this year, residents are encouraged to find ways to ShakeOut on October 15 at 10.15 am.



We encourage you to participate; register at Shakeoutbc.ca to be counted in the drill and for resources and information. Intended to create public awareness of earthquake hazards and encourage personal preparedness, participants Drop, Cover and Hold On for two minutes in response to a simulated earthquake event. Reminder - Leaves on Streets

Leaf control is the responsibility of property owners. Fall street sweeping by the City is intended to remove leaves which fall onto the streets and may result in blocked catch basins and safety hazards for cyclists. Leaves must not be raked or blown from lawns onto the street in anticipation of the sweeper truck. Doing so overwhelms the capacity of the sweeper and when blown across sidewalks, leaves may compromise pedestrian safety. Blowing or raking leaves into the gutter is illegal and subject to a fine of \$75 (Traffic Bylaw 1436).
