



# PARKING & TRAFFIC



## Traffic Bylaw No. 1436



### **Can bylaw officers address speeding, loud mufflers or other moving vehicle violations?**

No. Moving vehicle violations are enforced by the RCMP.

### **I would like speed bumps or parking signage in my neighbourhood; whom I should I ask?**

Request for traffic calming measures or signage should be directed to the City engineering department.

### **Who enforces parking?**

Bylaw officers and RCMP can enforce parking regulations. Parking in the downtown core is enforced by a Commissionaire under contract to the City.

### **How long can I park on the street?**

You may park a vehicle in a legal on-street parking space for 24 hours UNLESS signage advises otherwise or unless your vehicle is longer than 6 metres in length or weighs more than 4500 kg.

### **Can I park my RV on the street?**

Yes, with some restrictions. You may park a recreational vehicle in a legal on-street parking space as long as it is attached to a vehicle capable of towing it and for no more than 2 hours if the combined length is longer than 6 metres or weighs more than 4500 kg.

### **How do I know where I can park?**

Look for signage in the area and familiarize yourself with the bylaw. If you have questions, call the City BEFORE you park.

### **What are common parking infractions?**

Common parking infractions include:

- Overtime parking
- Parking against signage
- Parking in a disabled space with no permit displayed
- Parking too close to a driveway, crosswalk or fire hydrant
- Parking a commercial loading zone



## MAKING A COMPLAINT

To make a bylaw complaint you need to provide:

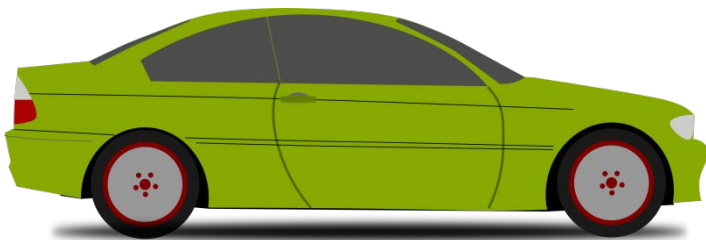
- Time, date and duration of parking offence
- Location/address of vehicle
- Description of vehicle (colour, make, model)
- Licence plate number of vehicle
- Your name, address, phone number and email



Complaints can be submitted in person, by mail, by email or by phone.  
Your contact information will be kept confidential.

## Did you know?

- Parking complaints cannot be lodged for vehicles parked on private property unless more than one unlicensed vehicle is parked outside of a garage or carport.
- The City uses signage to indicate parking limitations. Don't rely on painted curbs or other indicators.
