#### **ENGAGE WITH US VIRTUALLY ON OCTOBER 27**



HDR, engagement specialists for the proposed aquatic and recreation multiplex, are working with the community to help conceptualize the project.

Originally planned in-person, the two workshops on October 27 will now be virtual. The 90-minute workshops, set for 1 pm and 6 pm, will include facilitated discussions, small-group exercises, and activities to determine how and where the multiplex could most benefit the community. Ongoing, the atrium in the Parksville Civic and Technology Centre will feature display boards to help understand the engagement process. Residents will learn about the project's history, review the feasibility study and recent field studies, and catch up on engagement efforts to date. #### BC SHAKEOUT - OCTOBER 21 AT 10:21 AM

As we adapt to living and working during the COVID-19 pandemic earthquakes, storms, forest fires and other natural disasters continue. One

of the ways to be prepared is to practice how to be safe during an earthquake. Residents are encouraged to find ways to ShakeOut on October 21 at 10:21 am.

We encourage you to participate; register at *Shakeoutbc.ca* to be counted in the drill and for resources. Intended to create public awareness of earthquake hazards and encourage



personal preparedness, participants *Drop, Cover and Hold On* for two minutes in response to a simulated earthquake event. There's an emergency preparedness guidebook on the <u>EMO website</u> to help you organize or refresh your emergency supply kits as well as preparedness info.

#### PARKSVILLE ENGAGEMENT ON URBAN FOREST SRATEGY



We are working with Diamond Head Consulting to develop an Urban Forest Strategy to provide baseline information about the state of the urban forest, develop a long-term vision, and adopt tangible goals to grow and manage our urban forest to sustain future generations.

Public engagement on the Urban Forest Strategy currently underway, will continue until October 22. Thank you to those who participated in the first round of engagement; please spread the word to ensure the vision for the urban forest includes the many voices that shape our community. There will be a second opportunity to have your voice heard during winter 2022, during the second round of engagement on the draft Urban Forest Strategy. Our goal is to complete the strategy in March 2022.

The public can learn more about the Urban Forest Strategy and provide their input by participating in three online engagement tools on the <u>Let's Talk Parksville</u> project page. Visit Let's Talk Parksville through the end of October to take a survey, share your ideas, and submit a mapping location.



We want to hear from you! To have your opinion shape Parksville's urban forest, be sure to:

- 1. Take the 15-minute <u>SURVEY</u> to share what you value in the urban forest and priorities for management to inform the vision, principles, goals, and targets in the Urban Forest Strategy.
- 2. Use the <u>MAP</u> tool to share locations where you value the urban forest and locations where you would like to see improvements to the urban forest throughout the City. Let the project team know why it is an

important urban forest location and the reasons why you visit the area. You can also upload a photo of the urban forest location to show us and other community members what you are describing. You can submit as many locations as you wish, and view locations submitted by other community members.

3. Share your ideas for the Urban Forest Strategy with the project team using the <u>IDEAS</u> tool and read what others are suggesting.

#### Reminder about leaves on

streets - leaf control is the responsibility of property owners. Fall street sweeping by the City is intended to remove leaves which fall onto the streets and may result in blocked catch basins and safety hazards for cyclists. Leaves must not be raked or blown from lawns onto the street in anticipation of the sweeper truck. Doing so overwhelms the sweeper's capacity and when blown across sidewalks, leaves may compromise pedestrian safety. Blowing or raking leaves into the gutter is illegal and subject to a fine of \$75 (Traffic Bylaw 1436).



Utility notices are due Friday, October 29. If you did not receive your notice in the mail, please contact the finance department at 250 248-6144. City Hall is open for payments; however, we encourage the public to pay by Canada Post or through online or telephone banking. For online banking, add the City as a payee by searching Parksville, choose the utility option and enter your six-digit account number (not the folio or access code).
