Recruiting Now!

Do you have what it takes to be a paid on-call firefighter? In January, Parksville Fire will officially kick off the 2022 recruitment campaign. We are looking for positive, energetic and community minded women and men to join our dedicated team of paid on-call firefighters.



Firefighters care about and wish to be actively involved in their community. They have courage, dedication and a willingness to learn new skills and face new challenges. We provide an outstanding training program and the opportunity to make an unforgettable difference in the lives of our residents.



Recruit classes begin in the spring with applications accepted until March 4. You need to live within our fire protection area (ideally within City boundary), be reasonably fit, available for weekly fire practices, have a good driving record and between ages 19 and 60 for regular members. No experience necessary, just a willingness to learn.

If you are interested in taking on the challenge and before applying, learn about the position, what is required and the steps in the selection process. We also need you to fully understand the commitment we ask of our paid on-call firefighters. Call the fire station during business hours (Monday to Friday, 8 am to 4 pm) to speak with an officer or arrange a tour. Closing date is March 4. Details and applications on our **website**.

Licence Renewals for 2022

Due January 31, 2022, City of Parksville dog and business licence renewals mailed to residents and businesses, may now be paid.

2022 Business Licences - renewals are due January 31, 2022, and fees which remain unpaid after January 31 will be subject to fines.

- Credit card (Visa or Mastercard) payments from the City's website.
- By mail (P O Box 1390, Parksville V9P 2H3)
- Dropbox at City Hall (100 Jensen Avenue East)
- In-person at City Hall (weekdays, 8 am to 4 pm)

2022 Dog Licences - fees are due by January 31. If you do not receive a notice in December and currently own a dog, licences may be purchased in-person from City Hall (weekdays, 8 am to 4 pm) and the BCSPCA (open Tuesday to Saturday, noon to 4 pm).



The main benefit of licensing is the quick return of dogs should they become lost. As well, fees collected help to offset the cost to maintain our off-leash dog park, provide bags and dispensers

throughout the City and provide bylaw enforcement to handle public safety concerns of stray, off-leash and dangerous dogs.

All dogs older than six months must wear a municipal dog tag, which must be renewed yearly. Rates for tags:

As well, the emergency support services reception centre accommodated residents from Halalt First Nation near Chemainus who were displaced because of flooding.

Parksville Community Centre

Renovations to operate the PCC as the Parksville Child and Family Centre will soon begin and while underway, Island Health is operating a vaccine clinic in the PCC through spring. Space in the PCC is also available for Emergency Management Oceanside offices and reception centre setup should it be required. The PCC is expected to open for BGC Central Vancouver Island summer 2022 programs with licensed childcare spaces available September 2022, along with community access to the centre.

Outdoor Theatre Construction

Construction on the new outdoor theatre in the Parksville Community Park is now underway. Copcan Civil Ltd was awarded the contract to construct the outdoor theatre along with water, storm and sanitary infrastructure. Initial work includes tree

removal, equipment and materials delivery and fencing. Site excavation will start in mid December with completion May 2022. Ravenhill Road in the park is closed to vehicle traffic, Monday to Friday and open weekends.

Memorial and Hirst Avenues Project Update

Hirst Avenue West between McMillan Street South and the Alberni Highway has its first layer of asphalt, with Knappett Industries completing this work on November 29

ahead of winter storms. This base layer of pavement provides road users with a smooth and tidy surface throughout the winter, with the final layer of pavement scheduled for the spring. Since this is the base layer of asphalt, you may notice some of the other infrastructure is a little higher or lower than the pavement's surface; these elevation differences will be addressed with the final layer of pavement.

Memorial Avenue at its intersection with the Alberni Highway is now closed. Local traffic is being maintained on Memorial Avenue for access to businesses and residences. Please be patient with construction crews and traffic control personnel who are working through weather to complete this project in a timely manner.
