Permissive Tax Exemptions

Under the provisions of the *Community Charter*, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Application deadline is 4 pm, June 30. Details, form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the [website](#).

Water Restrictions

We are at Stage 1 water restriction for the remainder of April and then Stage 2 restrictions are in effect May through September (unless otherwise notified). Stage 2 allows for every other day lawn watering between 7 and 10 am or 7 and 10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Please note vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions. Schedule was mailed to residents with utility notices in March. ops@parksville.ca.

- **Utility notices** for the City of Parksville are due April 29. If you have not received your notice, contact 250 248-6144 or cashier@parksville.ca
- **No dogs allowed on beaches** - Rath Trevor Beach and Parksville Bay Beach are closed to dogs, on and off-leash, until April 30.
- **Tree rebate program** - we offer a \$50 rebate for the owner of a residence or business who wishes to plant a tree on their property. Details and application on our [website](#).

EMPRESS TREE

Paulownia tomentosa

- Tree family - Paulowniaceae
- 10-25 m with large heart-shaped leaves
- Origin: Eastern Asia - Japan
- The empress tree is a fast growing tree in the landscape with panicles of large foxglove-like flowers in May.
- The seeds of the empress tree were planted at the birth of a daughter in Japan and China and made into a chest for the home when they married. It is considered a tree of good luck.
- Named in honour of Anna Paulowna, daughter of Tsar Paul I of Russia.

Council Sets 2022 Tax and Utility Rate Increases

Each year, the City creates a five-year financial plan which outlines how resources will be allocated to achieve Council's identified strategic goals in a fiscally responsible manner. Council actively sought input from the community by hosting three public meetings in March and inviting feedback through an online survey and correspondence. Open Parksville Council meetings to discuss the plan have now concluded.

At the March 30 meeting, Parksville Council set the rates for property tax and water and sewer services. The 2022-2026 financial plan and tax rates bylaws will be considered by Council at the April 20 meeting with property tax notices mailed to residents and businesses in May.
