
trails, floral displays, irrigation installation and maintenance, and horticulture and arborist services. All services which impact our daily lives.

Attention voters!

When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide **two pieces of identification**; one containing your name and address, the other containing your name and signature. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification (with at least one with a signature)

are still required and you will be required to make a "solemn declaration" as to your residency. Documents which may be accepted are listed on *Letstalkparksville.ca*.

Attention candidates!

Voters will be electing candidates for a four-year term. Those elected in 2022 will serve on Council until October 2026. Elections BC will manage the financial requirements and reporting for all local government election candidates as per the *Local Elections Campaign Financing Act*. Be Ready for Anything! Emergency Preparedness Week

Emergency Preparedness Week is a national event supported by Public Safety Canada, working closely with provincial and local government emergency management organizations, Indigenous organizations, non-governmental organizations, and the private sector. An annual event for over 25 years, the week is recognized during the first full week of May.

This year's theme is **Emergency Preparedness: Be Ready for Anything.** Everyone has a role to play in an emergency. EP Week is an opportunity for you to take action to ensure you are prepared to protect yourself, your family, and your community during an emergency. Emergency Management Oceanside is a partnership between the City of Parksville and Town of Qualicum Beach to provide large scale emergency support and disaster services to residents of our region. Things to Know...

Water Restriction Stage 2 - is in effect through September 30 (unless otherwise notified). Stage 2 allows for every other day lawn watering between 7-10 am or 7-10 pm for a maximum of two hours. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all watering restrictions.

Permissive Tax Exemptions - under the provisions of the *Community Charter*, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Application deadline is 4 pm, June 30. Details, form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the **website**.

Tree Rebate Program - we offer a \$50 rebate for the owner of a residence or business who wishes to plant a tree on their property. See our **website** for details.
