Parksville's 2024-2028 Financial Plan

Coming up next week is the first open Council meeting to discuss the 2024-2028 financial plan which guides how the City will provide services and infrastructure to residents. The five-year financial plan outlines how resources will be allocated to achieve Council's identified strategic goals and enable City departments to deliver services in a fiscally responsible manner. The City strives to maintain quality programs and services for our residents and keep property taxes and utility fees affordable for businesses and homeowners.

As part of the process, we are looking for your input. The public is encouraged to attend meetings where Council will discuss the provisional financial plan.



2024 Special Events Applications

We are now accepting applications from organizations and individuals wishing to hold special events at City-owned venues or on City streets; review process starts January 31. Annual events will be given priority provided the request is received by January 31, after which time applications will be addressed as first-time events on a first-come, first-served basis, based on availability. 2024 Business Licence Renewals

Licence renewals will be mailed in early December for payment of your 2024 business licences. Payment is due January 31 and fees which remain unpaid after January 31 will be subject to fines. Payment options are listed here. Please direct questions to **Biz@parksville.ca** or 250 954-4650.

2024 Dog Licence Renewals

Dog licences for 2024 must be purchased in person from City Hall starting December 1 and fees are due by January 31. If you do not receive a notice in December and currently own a dog, licences must be purchased in-person from City Hall (Monday to Friday, 8 am to 4 pm) and the BCSPCA (open Tuesday to Saturday, noon to 4 pm).



The main benefit of licensing is the quick return of dogs should they become lost. As well, fees collected help to offset the cost to maintain our off-leash dog park, provide bags and dispensers throughout the City and provide bylaw enforcement to handle public safety concerns of stray, off-leash and dangerous dogs.

All dogs over the age of six months must wear a municipal dog tag, which must be renewed yearly. Rates for dog licence tags are as follows:

By January 31

Spayed/neutered \$20, not spayed/neutered \$30

After January 31

Spayed/neutered \$25, not spayed/neutered \$35

Snow and Ice Control


Information about how we maintain and manage roadways during winter conditions is detailed in a news release available **here**. We maintain and manage about 100 kilometres of paved roadways, classified into three priorities.



- First Priority Roadways (A) about 23 kilometres of strategic and arterial roads which include transit routes, major access to hillside areas and emergency routes.
- Second Priority Roadways (B) about 11 kilometres of remaining hillside and collector routes.
- Third Priority Roadways (C) the remaining approximately 66 kilometres of local roads, cul-de-sacs, and laneways.

During snowfall, staff will continue to maintain first priority roads until they are in a reasonably safe winter condition, once those road conditions have stabilized, they will move to second priority and then third. If at anytime conditions worsen, staff will revert to first and second priority routes which may then take additional time to attend to third priority local and residential roads.
