#### Parksville's 2024-2028 Financial Plan

Coming up next week on Monday, December 11 is the second open Council meeting to discuss the 2024-2028 financial plan which guides how the City will provide services and infrastructure to residents. The meeting will be held in the Forum, 100 Jensen Avenue East from 10 am to noon and 2 to 4 pm. As part of the process, we are looking for your input and encourage residents to attend. Further meetings will be held in January and posted to our website soon.

The five-year financial plan outlines how resources will be allocated to achieve Council's identified strategic goals and enable City departments to deliver services in a fiscally responsible manner. The City strives to maintain quality programs and services for our residents and



keep property taxes and utility fees affordable for businesses and homeowners.

Here are some of the ways you can be involved and engage in the financial planning process:

- Attend the meeting on December 11, 10 am to noon and 2 to 4 pm.
- Learn about the financial plan. Let's Talk Parksville has details such as previous plans and frequently asked questions.


## Parksville Community Park Update

We are pleased with the progress of the recent projects in the Parksville Community Park. The gathering plaza and accessible connections project are now substantially complete and open to the public with most fencing removed and some minor finishing to come. Beyond creating a new space in the park for gathering and social events, a core goal of this project was to increase accessibility and pedestrian movement in the heart of the park. A key element to achieve better accessibility was the removal of curbing and elevation changes and the new raised speed table on Sandcastle Drive adjacent to the plaza supports a consistent and accessible elevation while also calming traffic through this busy pedestrian area. As well, the new washroom project is substantially complete; however, the building will remain closed until the urinals arrive in January. More info on Let's Talk Parksville.

## Transportation Master Plan Next Steps

The first of three phases of the transportation master plan process is nearing completion. This phase included data collection at major intersections in the City, an open house, online survey, and community group engagement meetings. The final step of phase one will be the *What We Heard* report to be provided in early 2024.

The second phase will focus on presenting and testing different scenarios and options for the future transportation network. Based on the public responses in phase one, these options will be presented for further community feedback in early 2024 through a second inperson engagement and another online survey. Details

Parksville Fire Rescue volunteer paid on-call and career firefighters provide fire and emergency response services in the Parksville Fire Protection Area. Our firefighters are highly skilled professionals who value integrity, honesty, selflessness, commitment, courage, and are hardworking and family oriented. We provide an outstanding training program, the opportunity to make a difference in people's lives and the chance to join a dedicated team.

So far this year, Parksville Fire has responded to almost 800 calls - structure fires, rescues, motor

We are now accepting applications from organizations and individuals wishing to hold special events at City-owned venues or on City streets; review process starts January 31. Annual events will be given priority provided the request is received by January 31, after which time applications will be addressed as first-time events on a first-come, first-served basis, based on availability. #### 2024 Business Licence Renewals

Licence renewals for 2024 will be mailed this week. Payment is due January 31 and fees which remain unpaid after January 31 will be subject to fines. Payment options are listed below. Please direct questions to **Biz@parksville.ca** or 250 954-4650.

### 2024 Dog Licence Renewals

2024 dog licence fees are due by January 31. If you own a dog, tags must be purchased in-person from City Hall (Monday to Friday, 8 am to 4 pm) and the BCSPCA (Tuesday to Saturday, noon to 4 pm). All dogs older than six months must be licensed. Until January 31, the rate is discounted – spayed/neutered dogs \$20 and \$30 for un-spayed or un-neutered dogs. The rate increases to \$25 and \$35 after January 31.

The main benefit of licensing is the quick return of dogs should they become lost. As

well, fees collected help to offset the cost to maintain our off-leash dog park, provide bags and dispensers throughout the City, and provide bylaw enforcement to handle public safety concerns of stray, off-leash and dangerous dogs.

- Homeowner grant December 31, 2023, is the deadline to claim a retroactive Home Owner Grant for 2022 (subject to qualifications) as well as deadline to defer 2022 property taxes. - The Red Dress Project honours Canada's missing and murdered Indigenous women.
