Parksville's 2024-2028 Financial Plan

In March, Council approved the 2024-2028 provisional financial plan bylaw. Both the five-year financial plan bylaw and property tax rates bylaw must be adopted by May 15 of each year. The next steps at upcoming meetings are outlined here:

- April 8 Committee of the Whole meeting to revisit the provisional 2024-2028 financial plan and provide updated and new information and confirm 2024 property tax and utilities' rates.
- **April 29** Special Council meeting for consideration of amended financial plan bylaw, tax rates bylaw and water and sewer rates bylaws.
- May 6 Adoption of bylaws considered at the April 29 Special Council meeting.

Parksville residents and taxpayers are encouraged to provide input and feedback on the financial plan by attending meetings, reviewing information on *Let's Talk Parksville* and providing comments by email to **Council@parksville.ca** or on **Let's Talk Parksville**.

- There will be a variety of food trucks in the parking lot by the sport fields, 11.30 am through early evening. No other vendors in the park with activities planned to finish around 7 pm.
- The park will be open for vehicle parking and Sandcastle Drive to Arbutus Point will close to vehicles for the day.

Annual Wood Chipping Program

The City's 2024 wood chipping program will take place April 2 through April 25 and will be the only wood chipping program offered this year. The City is divided into two zones - west of Craig Street and east of Craig Street. Properties located west of Craig Street will receive collection between April 2 and April 12 and collection for properties east of Craig Street is scheduled between April 15 and April 25. Materials must be at curbside by 8 am. Map and more information will be posted to our website.



REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW...

Watermain flushing which runs through April, is an important part of our ongoing maintenance program, ensuring the integrity of the water supply system. Flushing occurs mainly between 7.30 am and 3.30 pm, weekdays. Residents can expect some discolouration of water and intermittent drops in pressure and should keep a fresh supply of drinking water in your fridge. Check for discolouration of water before doing laundry and if discoloured, run an outside tap (after 3.30 pm) until it runs clear. **ops@parksville.ca**.

No dogs on beaches please - to limit disturbance of migrating Black Brant geese, our beaches are subject to temporary seasonal "no dog" restrictions. This applies to on-leash and off-leash within the Parksville-Qualicum Beach Wildlife Management Area. Rathtrevor Beach and Parksville Bay Beach are closed until April 30.

Stage 1 water restriction in April allows for watering of lawns between 7 pm and 7 am, any day. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from water restrictions.

Recycle BC pop-up depot in Parksville will continue this year, accepting free of charge, flexible plastic packaging, white and coloured foam packaging, glass packaging and paper packaging and cardboard. Materials may be dropped off from 10 am to 3 pm at 1080 Industrial Way, Parksville. For dates and more info visit Recycle BC **website**.
