
It's the first day of Spring, bringing longer days and fresh beginnings! Enjoy the warmer weather and the beauty of nature coming back to life.

Wood Chipping Program

Our annual wood chipping program starts on April 7 through to May 2. The City is divided into two zones - west and east of Craig Street; properties west of Craig will receive collection between April 7 and April 17 and properties east of Craig are scheduled between April 22 and May 2. Materials must be at curbside by 8 am on:

April 7 - For collection at properties WEST of Craig Street April 22 - For collection at properties EAST of Craig Street

New Outdoor Water Conservation Framework

Reminder to residents of the City's water conservation changes. Utility notices will be mailed to homeowners this month and will include details about the updated framework as well as indoor and outdoor water conservation tips. Refer to Let's Talk Parksville for more information.

<u>Restriction period extended to October 31</u> - responds to trend of longer, hotter summers. In recent years, restrictions have been in place beyond the previously defined September 30 end date.

New level 3 limits watering days to one day per week; oddnumbered houses on Monday and even-numbered houses on Thursday - adjusting this voluntary level to include tangible and measurable water conservation provides direction to residents on how to reduce water use and provide clarity on specific actions to limit water use should drought conditions become more severe.

New level 4 identical to previous stage 4 but with vehicle
washing allowed with shutoff nozzle - vehicle washing has
minimal impact on water supply and with car wash businesses open during level 4,
water would be used to wash cars regardless of whether at home or at car wash
business.

Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from all water conservation levels as are businesses which require water for operations, essential municipal sports fields and nurseries.


Next Steps in Parksville's 2025-2029 Financial Plan

The next meetings related to the City's 2025-2029 financial plan are outlined below. We encourage residents to attend the Committee of the Whole meeting on April 9 to provide input on the amended plan.

April 7 - Introduction of recommended amendments to financial plan and analysis of BC Assessment Revised Roll

April 9 - Committee of the Whole to discuss amendments and direction from Council on property, water and sewer rates

April 23 - Regular meeting - motions forwarded from April 9 meeting



May 5 - Three readings 2025-2029 amended financial plan bylaw and 2025 water, sewer and property tax rates bylaws

May 7 or 12 - Final adoption of 2025 amended financial plan and 2025 tax rates bylaws

Final 2025 property tax rates and utility rates for the City of Parksville will be set during this schedule of meetings. The forecasted rate increases for 2025 were 7% for property taxes, 6% for water fees and 6% for sewer fees, which will result in an increase of about \$175 for an average residential property. Property tax notices will be mailed by end of May, following adoption of the financial plan and property tax rate bylaws. Documents and presentations may be viewed on Let's Talk Parksville.

Elevator Upgrade – Parksville Civic and Technology Centre
The elevator in the Parksville Civic and Technology Centre will be out of service from

Ravensong Aquatic Centre Expansion Referendum On April 5 eligible electors from the City of Parksville, Town of Qualicum Beach and Regional District of Nanaimo (RDN) Electoral Areas (EA) E, F, G and H will decide if the Regional District of Nanaimo can borrow up to \$30 million to expand Ravensong Aquatic Centre.


The City's annual watermain flushing program which started mid February, continues through April. Flushing is an important part of our ongoing maintenance program to ensure the integrity of the water supply system for residents and businesses. Flushing will generally take place between the hours of 7.30 am and 3.30 pm, Monday to Friday. There's a map to determine when watermain flushing will take place in your area.

Water Conservation Level 1 in April allows for watering of lawns between 7 pm and 7 am, any day of the week. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from restrictions.
