Parksville Council Adopts 2025-2029 Financial Plan

The 2025-2029 financial plan, tax rates and utility rates bylaws were given final adoption by Council on May 8. The bylaws reflect a 5.5% increase in general municipal property taxes, a 6% increase in metered water and water parcel tax rates, and a 6% increase in sanitary sewer usage and parcel tax rates. The estimated increase for an average priced home is \$141.




Property tax notices will be mailed by the end of May and the due date for property taxes is July 2. In the event of a postal strike, you are responsible for ensuring your payment is received by the City by the due date to avoid penalty.

Residents Invited to Provide Input on Evacuation Route Planning

The City of Parksville, Town of Qualicum Beach and Regional District of Nanaimo are working together to develop an evacuation route plan for RDN Electoral Area G, the City and the Town. Identifying local knowledge of hazards and potential evacuation barriers is vital to effective route planning. As part of the planning process, impacted and affected residents and groups are invited to provide input through a survey until May 31. The feedback gathered will be used to help create a practical and effective evacuation plan. Parksville residents are encouraged to complete the survey by May 31 from our website.

The planning process will consider many factors, including risk areas, population size and demographics, transportation resources and traffic management as well as evacuation route availability and capacity, communications, animal welfare, identification of vulnerable populations,

REMINDERS AND THINGS TO KNOW...

Water Conservation Level 2 is in effect from May to October unless otherwise notified. Odd numbered civic addresses may water on odd numbered days and even numbered addresses may water

on even numbered days. Watering times are 7 am to 10 am OR 7 pm to 10 pm for a maximum of two hours of total allocated watering per day. Vegetable gardens and fruit trees are exempt from restrictions. For details about the City's water conservation program, refer to Let's Talk Parksville.



Permissive Tax Exemptions - under the provisions of the Community Charter, Council may exempt land and/or improvements from municipal property taxes for the next calendar year, subject to certain requirements which in general, restrict exemption to non-profit organizations using the lands for specific non-profit purposes. Application deadline is 4 pm, June 30. Details, form and policy may be obtained from City Hall or from the website [City Hall/Mayor and Council/Permissive Tax Exemptions].

Special watering permits to support newly planted or turfed lawns and/or landscaping are available on our website and may also be obtained from our operations department, 1116 Herring Gull Way, 8 am to 4 pm, Monday to Friday. [Quicklink – Water Restrictions]

No Open Buring or Fireworks - Residents are reminded all open burning and outdoor fires, excluding cooking fires, are prohibited in the Parksville Fire Protection Area. As well, beach fires in the Parksville Qualicum Wildlife Management Area are prohibited by provincial legislation; this includes all beaches from French Creek to Resort Drive. The sale of any type of fireworks is prohibited in the City of Parksville and all fireworks are banned within City limits. [parksvillefirerescue.ca]
