The Great BC Shakeout drill is scheduled for October 16 at 10.16 am. Every year on the third Thursday in October, millions of people around the world join to *Drop, Cover, Hold On* in their homes, workplaces or schools. This year we're encouraging to you register and take part.

Earthquake drills are an easy way to practice the steps you can take to protect yourself during an earthquake. The safest steps to take when you first feel an earthquake are to *Drop, Cover and Hold On.* A high number of injuries caused by earthquakes happen when people are trying to move around while the shaking is still taking place. Stop what you're doing, take cover under

something or protect your head and neck with your arm and hold on to something sturdy until after the shaking has stopped. If you aren't physically able to *Drop, Cover and Hold On*, perhaps you can *Lock or Brace, Cover and Hold On*.

Think about ways you can make your space safer. Many injuries from earthquakes occur when items fall onto people because of the force of the ground shaking. Perhaps you need to secure larger furniture to the wall, or remove picture frames

from above your couch or bed?

City to Remove Sequoia Tree at Morison and Island Highway West

The City of Parksville will proceed with the removal of the Giant Sequoia located at the corner of Morison Avenue and Island Highway West, adjacent to the town clock. This decision follows a comprehensive multi-year assessment and a recent arborist report which confirmed the health of the tree has continued to decline. The recommendation from the arborist is removal of the tree for safety and the protection of surrounding infrastructure. We expect removal to occur within the next month.



The Sequoia, planted around 1999, has over the past five years exhibited visible decline, with 30 to 40% of its canopy affected by fungal blight. Despite antifungal treatments and fertilizer applications, the tree's health has continued to deteriorate. The tree is growing in a small garden bed shared with a large oak tree and its roots have caused significant bulging and upheaval of adjacent sidewalk panels, resulting in ongoing maintenance challenges.

Phase 2 Waterfront Walkway Repairs

The second phase of the City's waterfront walkway replacement program delayed until later this month, is expected to take about one month. The section from the Parksville Community Park to in front of Park Sands Beach Resort will be replaced during this phase. While the work is underway, this section will be closed to the public and those wishing to use the walkway will be required to navigate around the construction area by walking on the beach. Signage and fencing will indicate the work zone.


