SUBJECT: 2008 MUNICIPAL PROPERTY TAX RATES

Issue

2008 Municipal Property Tax Rates

Executive Summary

In order for Finance to issue the 2008 tax notices, the new tax rates for 2008 need to be approved by Council.

In the 2008-2012 Financial Plan, Council has approved a 5% tax increase for 2008, so the new tax rates have been calculated with a 5% increase. The assessed values for the residential class increased by just over 10% for 2008, so the tax rate actually has to fall slightly, otherwise there would be a 10% increase in taxes. When the other levels of governments taxes are added in, the total tax increase for the average assessed home (\$313,000) is only 2.5% or \$56. The municipal share of that \$56 increase is about \$50.

Background

Section 197 of the Community Charter requires Council to establish by bylaw the property value taxes for it's own purposes and to meet the taxing obligations of the Regional District.

This bylaw is required to be adopted after the adoption of the financial plan but before May 15.

Council has the option of increasing the rates of each property class by the same amount or can vary the increase or decrease of particular property classes.

The attached Schedule of Property Tax Rates reflect the average property tax increase of 5% on existing properties as proposed in the 2008 Financial Plan. Property taxes on new construction are new taxes and are in addition to the 5% increase.

The average assessed value for a Single Family Dwelling (SFD) increased by about 10% in 2008 from 2007, so for a SFD that had a 10% increase in assessed value, the <u>municipal portion</u> of the property taxes should increase by 5%. Properties with an assessed value increase that is greater than 10%, will see a larger than 5% increase in their municipal taxes and properties with an assessed value that increased less than 10% will have a

lower tax increase. For a residential property valued at the average residential value of \$313,000, total property taxes are estimated to increase \$56 from 2007 (assuming that property assessment increased by 10%).

For information purposes, attached to this report is Appendix 1 which shows the draft tax rates for the City and all other taxing jurisdictions.

Options

- 1. Approve the 2008 Tax Rate Schedule attached.
- 2. Make revisions to the 2008 Tax Rate Schedule.

Analysis

- 1. Approving the attached 2008 Tax Rate schedule is necessary to generate the property tax revenues that are approved in the 2008 Financial Plan.
- 2. Increasing or decreasing the tax rates will result in an increase or decrease in tax revenues and a rate increase that is higher or lower than the 5% included in the Financial Plan. Council could consider adjusting the tax rates of certain classes to shift the tax burden to different classes. For example, our light industry class has a tax rate lower than the business tax rate. This is not the case in most other municipalities and the rates used for School tax and BC Assessment tax.

Financial Considerations:

Approving the proposed tax rates will leave our Prior years Surplus at a lower level than the recommended \$1,000,000 at the end of 2012.

Adjusting the Tax rates downward will result in a budget revenue shortfall and budget revisions will be necessary to maintain our prior year surplus. Adjusting the rates higher will reduce the 2008 budgetary shortfall but will result in an average tax increase that is higher than 5%.

Recommendation:

THAT the report dated April 28, 2008 from the Director of Finance entitled "2008 Municipal Property Tax Rates" be received for information;

AND THAT "Tax Rates Bylaw, 2008 No. 1445" be advanced for reading consideration by Council.

ISSUE:

Follow-up report to March 28, 2008 Fireworks Bylaw Amendment Report

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report is a follow up to the one submitted to Council on April 5, proposing amendments to the fireworks bylaw that would permit the storage of consumer fireworks for wholesale purposes, as recommended by the Citizens Advisory Committee.

REFERENCES:

Draft Bylaw No. 1427.1

BACKGROUND:

At the April 7, 2008 Council meeting, the proposed amendment to the Fireworks Bylaw that would permit the storage of consumer fireworks for wholesale purposes was presented to Council and the following two resolutions were adopted:

THAT the report from the Director of Administrative Services, dated March 28, 2008, entitled "Fireworks Bylaw Amendment" be received;

AND THAT the following recommendation from the Citizen's Advisory Committee be approved:

"THAT 'City of Parksville Fireworks Regulation Bylaw, 2007, No. 1427', be amended to allow storage of fireworks for wholesale purposes, not to exceed a specified quantity as determined reasonable by the Parksville Fire Department";

AND FURTHER THAT "Fireworks Bylaw, 2007, No. 1427.1" be advanced for reading consideration.

THAT staff be requested to bring forward, for Council's consideration, an amendment to the zoning bylaw that would prohibit the storage of fireworks in residential zones.

When the bylaw was submitted to Council at their April 21, 2008 meeting for reading consideration the following resolution was adopted:

THAT "Fireworks Regulation Amendment Bylaw, 2008, No. 1427.1" be referred back to staff regarding the issue of storage of fireworks in a residential zone.



Since that time the following actions have taken place:

- 1. An amendment to the Zoning Bylaw to prohibit the storage of fireworks and explosives in all residential zones has been prepared and will be submitted to Council for first and second reading consideration at their May 5, 2008 Council meeting.
- 2. A legal opinion has been requested on whether the City can require the removal of a fireworks storage facility in a residential zone once the zoning bylaw is amended to prohibit this activity and whether the city can register a notice against the title to the property where the fireworks are stored as a warning to future adjacent owners. As of the writing of this report we have not received a reply to the request.

The suggestion was made at the April 21 Council meeting that the Fireworks bylaw amendment should refer to the Zoning bylaw. Staff does not feel this is necessary for the following reasons:

- 1. When one bylaw makes reference to another bylaw, administratively it makes the tracking of amending or repealing bylaws difficult in that all bylaws have to be searched for the references to the bylaw that is being amended or repealed.
- 2. Under the accepted principles of bylaw drafting the practice of making reference in one bylaw to another is not encouraged as it is an inclusion that has no purpose under law. Doing so can in fact hinder the interpretation of the bylaw if the referenced bylaw changes to such an extent that it is no longer consistent with the bylaw.
- 3. The issue of storage of fireworks and explosives in residential areas will be adequately covered off in the zoning bylaw.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

THAT the report dated April 29, 2008 from the Director of Administrative Services entitled "Fireworks Bylaw Amendment – Follow Up" be received for information;

AND THAT "Fireworks Bylaw, 2007, No. 1427.1" be advanced for reading consideration.

BYLAW NO. 1427,1

A BYLAW TO AMEND FIREWORKS REGULATION BYLAW NO. 1427

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the City of Parksville in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

1. That "Fireworks Regulation Bylaw, 2007, No. 1427" is amended by adding a new Section 3.1 in the appropriate location as follows:

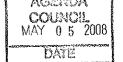
"3.1 EXCEPTIONS

- 1. Storage of consumer fireworks shall be permitted only if all the following conditions are met:
 - a. The consumer fireworks are stored only for the purpose of wholesale sales to retailers or distributors outside of the City of Parksville;
 - b. The wholesale business storing the consumer fireworks holds a valid business license with the City of Parksville;
 - c. The wholesale business storing the consumer fireworks holds the required licenses and permits from the Federal and/or Provincial governments
 - d. The Fire Chief is advised of the location where the consumer fireworks are stored: and
 - e. The quantity of the consumer fireworks stored is approved by the Fire Chief."
- 2. This bylaw may be cited for all purposes as "Fireworks Regulation Amendment Bylaw, 2008, No. 1427.1".
