Parksville Fire's Boots for Food Drive

This year's Boots for Food drive for the Parksville Volunteer Fire Department was a huge success. Physically distanced and masked, our firefighters were at locations throughout Parksville asking residents to fill the boots for food. A total of \$93,464 cash was collected over the weekend along with new unwrapped toys for the Society of Organized Services.

Once again, Craig Bay residents were beyond generous, donating a record amount of \$58,635 and 3,676 pounds of food. The fire department raised \$34,829 and 600 pounds of food.

Each year, residents in the Parksville Fire Protection Area generously support the annual drive and are the reason this campaign is so successful. The Parksville Fire Department appreciates the generosity of our residents who make the world of difference to many families in our community.

- **Salvation Army food bank** donations are accepted at 886 Wembley Road, Monday to Friday from 8 am to 11.30 am and on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 1 pm to 3.30 pm.
