Things we'd like you to know about Canada Day in Parksville

- Free family-friendly fun in the sun kicks off with the Parksville Canada Day parade followed by afternoon activities in the Parksville Community Park.
- The Parksville Outdoor Theatre will feature *Bobs and Lolo* for the young and young at heart, and the band, *Apollos*, will provide afternoon dance music.
- Buskers will entertain in the new gathering plaza from 1 pm to early evening.
- There will be a variety of food trucks in the parking lot by the sport fields from 11 am through early evening.
- There will be no vendors in the park and planned activities will finish around 7 pm.
- Sandcastle Drive to Arbutus Point will close to vehicles for the day with vehicle parking available in the park.
