

Your Parksville. Your Priorities.

What are your priorities for Parksville? City of Parksville Council is seeking input from Parksville residents to help determine Council strategic priorities for the next three years. An online survey open from April 30 to May 20 is available from the home page of the City's website at www.parksville.ca or you may access the survey by following this link: <https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/parksvillepriorities>

In January, Mayor Ed Mayne brought together members from the Parksville community at the Mayor's Roundtable to start a conversation and learn what residents love about Parksville, all intended to help determine the priority actions the community wishes Council to focus on during their term of office. The Mayor's Roundtable participants came away with five key priorities – housing, healthcare, recreation, community safety and economic development. The roundtable summary report may be viewed on the City's website.

Now, it's your turn! Council is looking for feedback, comments and suggestions from Parksville residents to help identify priorities which will influence Council's strategic priorities for the next three years. Understanding resident priorities will then assist Council when making decisions about priorities and so available resources can best be assigned to achieve them.
