

November is Adoption Awareness Month in Parksville

Mayor Ed Mayne has proclaimed November as “Adoption Awareness Month” in Parksville. This month provides the opportunity to recognize the care, compassion and unselfish commitment of British Columbia adoptive families and to remind citizens there are many children and sibling groups who are waiting for adoption.

According to the Ministry of Children and Family Development, an annual average of approximately 270 children have been adopted in British Columbia, but there continues to be a need for adoptive families to nurture the growth and development of children, especially those with special needs because of physical, mental or emotional disabilities.

Potential adoptive parents come from a diverse range of backgrounds; anyone over the age of 19 who is interested in providing a stable, loving home may be eligible to adopt. It is thanks to these selfless individuals that many children receive the immeasurable benefits of belonging to a family, including the support, assistance and advice necessary to face the challenges of growing up.

The Adoptive Families Association of British Columbia (AFABC) has been supporting adoptive families in British Columbia for more than 40 years.
