Highlights from Council Meeting on July 18, 2022

Mayor Mayne recognized the Coast Salish peoples and their traditional territory upon which we gather with gratitude.

Mayor Mayne invited the public to the official opening of the Parksville Outdoor Theatre on July 22 at 6.30 pm in the Parksville Community Park.

DELEGATIONS

- Council received a presentation from Timberlake-Jones Engineering regarding zoning and development bylaw amendment applications at 625 and 633 Pioneer Crescent and 211 Martindale Road.

CORRESPONDENCE

- Letter received from G. Blackthorne thanking the City for the scholarship.

REPORTS

- Council received a report regarding consideration of the permanent closure of a lane and park contribution at 703 Turner Road.
- Council approved funding for a budget shortfall for a truck purchase for parks and approved funding for an operations yard environmental study for \$34,000.
- Council received a verbal report on the Local Government Climate Action Program.
- Council received reports on zoning and development bylaw amendments for 625 and 633 Pioneer Crescent and 211 Martindale Road to facilitate small-lot residential development.
- Council issued a development variance permit to facilitate the repurposing of an existing dwelling as an accessory carriage house at 156 Ford Avenue.
- Council approved a budget amendment to purchase laptops and accessories for the incoming 2022 Council.
- Council received a follow-up report on the proposed Parksville Aquatic and Recreation Centre and an update on the 2022 workplan.
- P. Zsombor was appointed as a bylaw enforcement officer.

BYLAWS

- Council gave first reading to "Zoning and Development Amendment Bylaw, 2022, No. 2000.139" a map amendment to Small Lot Residential SLR-1 at 625 and 633 Pioneer Crescent and "Zoning and Development Amendment Bylaw, 2022, No. 2000.140" a map amendment to Small Lot Residential SLR-1 at 211 Martindale Road.
- Council gave second reading to "Plan Parksville Amendment Bylaw, 2022, No. 1492.6" to amend the map from "Single Unit Residential and Planned Neighbourhood" to only the "Planned Neighbourhood" designation at 1465 Greig Road, and second reading to "Zoning and Development Amendment Bylaw, 2022, No. 2000.138," a map and text amendment from Agriculture A-1 zone to Comprehensive Development CD-33 Zone at 1465 Greig Road, and scheduled a public hearing for both bylaws on September 19, 2022, at 6 pm.
- Three readings were given to "Road Closure Bylaw, 2022, No. 1580," to close part of a highway, remove the dedication of part of a highway, and dispose and convey the land for the lane abutting the northern boundary of the property at 703 Turner Road, and third reading to "Zoning and Development Amendment Bylaw, 2022, No. 2000.133, " to facilitate residential use on a portion of the first storey of the building at 164 Alberni Highway.

NOTICE OF MOTION

- Council directed staff to begin the process to convert a portion of the land behind the Parksville Civic and Technology Centre and adjacent to Stanford Place to formal public parking, with consideration to relocate/ replace memorial plaques and trees that may be affected and prepare the appropriate design, approval and budget processes to facilitate this project in 2022.
- Council directed staff to investigate additional security measures around the outdoor theatre and within the Parksville Community Park.

The next regular meeting of Council will be held on Wednesday, September 7, 2022, at 6 pm in the Forum.
