Highlights from Council Meeting on September 9, 2020

Mayor Mayne recognized the Coast Salish peoples and their traditional territory upon which we gather with gratitude.

Delegations

- The Parksville Beach Festival Society provided an update on the Parksville Community Park outdoor performance stage project. Council directed staff to take the lead on project management and contract approvals to facilitate compliance with grant funding requirements.

Reports

- Council accepted payment in lieu of parkland for the subdivision at 1180 Resort Drive.
- Council approved issuance of a development permit to authorize a four-storey hotel, four storey commercial/residential building and a five-storey multi-family residential building at 1180 Resort Drive.
- A zoning amendment application at 115 McMillan Street South was advanced.
- Council approved the appointment of the City's financial statement auditors for the year ending December 31, 2020.
- Staff were directed to undertake clean-up of an unsightly property at 146 James Street.
- A Grant-in-Aid Select Committee was appointed to consider applications received for the fall funding intake.

Bylaws

- Bylaw No. 2000.129, a text amendment to Comprehensive Development CD-19A at 115 McMillan Street South, received second reading and was advanced to a public hearing on Monday, October 19 at 3 pm.
- Two bylaws were adopted:
 - Bylaw No. 1566 to establish municipal officer positions; and
 - Bylaw No. 1492.3, a map amendment to mixed use (tourist commercial) at 1180 Resort Drive.
- Bylaw No. 2000.123, a map and text amendment to Comprehensive Development CD-29 at 1180 Resort Drive, had third reading rescinded, was read a third time as amended and adopted as amended.

Notice of Motion/New Business

- Council passed a motion to request that the provincial Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch extend expanded service areas for food primary, liquor primary and manufacturing licensees for another year, until October 31, 2021.
- Council directed staff to prepare a report on the implications of allowing zero emission neighbourhood vehicles.
- Council directed staff to include a potential Parksville Community Park food concession in fall budget discussions.
- Mayor Mayne provided notice of a motion regarding zoning amendments for accessory buildings.

The next regular meeting of Council will be held on Monday, October 5 at 3 pm in the Forum.
