The City, in partnership with Vancouver Island University, Master of Community Planning Program and Mount Arrowsmith Biosphere Region Research Institute has begun a consultation strategy which will lead to the development of a new comprehensive Parks, Trails and Open Spaces Master Plan. One of the key elements in the strategy is engaging residents about their vision and priorities for parks and open spaces within the City as public engagement is an integral part of a new Parks, Trails and Open Spaces Master Plan.

Online Survey

On July 17, a survey will be available from the home page of the City's website with a series of questions to assist the VIU team to identify goals and priorities for the future of parks, trails and open spaces and also guide the development of the new master plan. We hope to learn what it is about these spaces our residents enjoy, what might be missing and also what changes our residents wish to see in the future.

The survey should take about ten minutes to complete and will be open from July 17 until August 10. Survey responses are anonymous and just one response per person please.

Open Houses

Student led open houses will be held in the Atrium, Parkville Civic and Technology Centre as follows:

- Thursday, July 19 2 - 4 pm
- Wednesday, July 25 3 - 6 pm
- Tuesday, July 31 2 - 4 pm

The purpose of the open houses is to assist residents with the survey and answer questions about this project. A large scale map of City parks, trails and open spaces will be available to help anyone wishing to complete a paper copy of the survey.

At the **Wednesday, July 25** open house, VIU students will present the consultation data completed to date and engage with residents to refine recommendations for the parks, trails and open spaces network. The open house will include dotmocracy posters, interactive maps and also an opportunity to speak with the students about ideas.

PARKVILLE VOTES 2018

All voters will register on the day of voting, at either advance voting or on general voting day. When arriving to vote, you will be required to provide two pieces of identification; one containing your name and address, the other containing your name and signature. If you do not have documentation showing residency, then two pieces of identification (with at least one with a signature) are still required and you will be required to make a "solemn declaration" as to your residency.

Nomination packages will be available from the City's administration offices during regular office hours (8 am to 4 pm, Monday to Friday, excluding statutory holidays) from 9 am on Friday, July 27 to 4 pm on Friday, September 14.

Non-resident property owner

The property must be in the name(s) of individuals and not in the name of a company. If you own property in the City of Parkville, but live somewhere else in British Columbia, you may be eligible to vote as a **non-resident property elector** if you:

- Are a Canadian citizen; AND
- Are, or will be, 18 years of age or older (October 20, 2000) on or before general voting day; AND
- Have lived in BC for at least 6 months (as of April 19, 2018) prior to registration; AND
- Have owned the property in the City of Parkville for at least 30 days before you register to vote (as of September 19, 2018); AND
- You must not be eligible to register as a resident elector in the City of Parkville; AND
- Are not disqualified from voting by the Local Government Act or any other act.

Non-resident property electors must bring to the voting place, in addition to two pieces of acceptable identification, proof of ownership in the form of a tax notice, assessment notice or other legal documentation proving property ownership, such as a bill of sale issued prior to September 19. Non-resident property electors can only vote once, regardless of the number of properties they own in the City of Parkville.


Things to Know

Water Restrictions

Stage 2 continues through September unless otherwise advised. Sprinkling can only occur on even days for even-numbered houses and on odd days for odd-numbered houses and is permitted for a maximum of two hours between 7-10 am or 7-10 pm for not more than two hours per day.
